Summer Games

Summer Games Committee make first distribution to Village organisations. Under the new organisation, 80% of Summer Games net income ie £1,280, has already been given to the Village Hall. £800 (the remaining 20%, plus net income from the Race Night) was advertised in the last Messenger as available for distribution to village organisations. A number of applications were received and the Committee were delighted to be able to

distribute the sum as follows: Pre-School. A contribution towards the cost of an LCD display screen.

School. Purchase of wet weather clothing to allow outside activities in inclement conditions.

Rangers Football Club. A contribution towards the cost of pitch hire.

Senior Youth Club. Payment for an ice-skating trip.

Minibus replacement. A request for a contribution towards the replacement fund was declined due to the limited funds available. Instead the committee agreed to dedicate all the profits from the planned Fun Run in April /May 2012 towards the replacement, with the hope that this would generate a significant sum.

An enormous "thank you" to all those involved in raising this money for your hard

work, without which there would be no money to distribute. We hope to be able to do even better in future years so that these funds can realise real benefits to the community.
