The Osmotherley Area Parish Plan

We reflect on the Osmotherley Area Parish Plan, published in December 2006. A Parish Plan is a process that involves consultation with rural communities, culminating in a written report and recommended actions to address the issues that respondents consider important.

Fast facts:

- The Parish Plan was two years in the making. Initiated by the Parish Council, a Steering Group and five Working Groups were formed of around 40 local residents.
- Three separate questionnaires were prepared: one to each adult resident, which contained more than 50 questions; a shortened version for 11-17-year-olds; and a third questionnaire for visitors.
- It was distributed to people living in and using the Osmotherley, Thimbleby, Sheepwash, Clack, Chequers, Ellerbeck and Snilesworth areas.
- Questions covered the natural environment; the built environment; sport and recreation; school and churches; community and services; business and transport; traffic and parking; and security and communication.
- The Three Tuns, The Golden Lion and the Queen Catherine pubs offered dinner prizes as an incentive to complete the questionnaires.
- More than 50% of residents and 40 visitors responded. Of the adult questionnaires, 300-plus were returned, constituting more than 8,000 pages.
- In response to the completed questionnaires, more than 120 recommended actions were suggested, and many were subsequently implemented.
- A glossy summary booklet and a more detailed fact book were produced, containing background information, response data and recommended actions. Both of these can be accessed at www.osmotherley.org.uk/parish-plan/ or hard copies obtained from the National Park Authority and Hambleton District Council.

Parish Council

The council met to discuss the issues of the day with a majority of members present. The meeting was also attended by Mr A Shelley who came to discuss the future of Thompsons Shop. Bought by Thimbleby Estate in 2013, to safeguard the heritage of the shop, and to determine if a village shop could have a future as a viable business. A healthy discussion ensued and it was made clear that any new shop would have to be aware of current village services but also be self-sustaining going forward. Further discussions would take place in the near future. Concern was expressed by a resident over the state of the footpath to the footbridge at the water splash on the way to Thimbleby (Bog Hole?). It is in an almost permanent muddy and slippery state. Enquiries of Highways confirmed they were aware of the problem but no specific timeframe as to when this would be acted upon was forthcoming. The Chairman reported that £2500 had been secured from NYCC Locality Budget with £1000 available for the CCTV scheme and a further bid for £1500 was secured as a contribution towards the disabled access bridges at Sheepwash. The bus shelter had been vandalised and needs disinfecting. The Cumbria Clock Company had finally completed the restoration of the clock face which all agree has been done to a high standard. The role of Caretaker has been under review and following interest from other possible contractors has resulted in the current provider winning the continued work contract. The community bus 'team' has been provided with financial support to ensure the continued work of the bus in the community.
