Parish Council

The August meeting of Osmotherley Area Parish Council heard that there are serious concerns regarding the effectiveness of Highways to tackle road problems as they arise. For many months the parish has corresponded, to no avail to have potholes and white or yellow lining and drainage repaired at a number of locations in all of the parishes concerned. Many residents have lodged complaints either verbally or in writing and that this Highways response should no longer be tolerated. However the overdue work to the road through Thimbleby is to be carried out over a period of two weeks in September.

Members heard that poaching is on the increase with those responsible breaking through locked gates as they go about their activities. Please report any suspicious activity on 101 to the Police as soon as an incident of any description is seen. This also applies to the anti social behaviour as seen at Codbeck and other places. There has even been an incident of road rage where a motorist dragged his caravan between other vehicles but it appears that the only damage he caused was to his own caravan.

Recently some used car vendors have taken to parking their sale vehicles on the grass verges and village greens, this practice is not legal and is deplored by the PC, these owners will be contacted to ensure this does not become a regular occurrence.

Royal British Legion –black mystery request

David Black, the Chairman Osmotherley Royal British Legion Branch, has unearthed a sixty year old mystery and would welcome help from anyone who can provide more information about a long deceased First War veteran.

A silver cup inscribed; Arthur Taylor Memorial Trophy, presented to the

Osmotherley Branch British Legion in 1950 has been unused for many years.

Originally the trophy was for the village darts and domino competition, events which have long disappeared, resulting in the trophy gathering dust. “We know that Arthur Taylor was a soldier in the first war who lived for many years in our

village, playing an active part in the community.

He owned the ‘top shop’, served as a parish councillor and was actively involved in the establishment of the Cod Beck Reservoir water project. During the 1950s he and his wife moved to Whitby where it is understood they remained for the rest of their lives.” You can contact David Black on 883198

I am Syd Howlett and have lived in Osmotherley for the last 5 years; I would like to introduce myself as one of the **Osmotherley Oil Cooperative's** new coordinators. Ellen Cross was looking to stand down, and I foolishly (?) said I would take over. On behalf of all members of the cooperative I would like to thank Ellen for all the hard work that she has put in over many months and I hope that I can help to run the cooperative as smoothly.

How does it work? Every other month the Cooperative Coordinator email members asking for order amounts. The coordinator negotiates with various companies for prices based on the total volume and places the order. The oil is delivered on agreed days, and the supplier sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier from the member within two weeks by cheque or credit card. Members only order when oil is required – they don't have to order oil each time.
