Parish Council

The last meeting, before a short summer recess, took place in the lovely surroundings of Kirby Sigston Village Hall. A majority of members attended and discussions began with a report from the Police on anti social incidents at Sheepwash, auto crime and criminal damage.

The issue of assisting HDC with distribution of recycling clear plastic sacks was considered and further discussions required between authorities. Following discussions over the last few meetings, an unsightly and dangerous parking space in the village centre has been resurfaced by the PC. The church clock face had been reported as requiring attention and the PC is responsible for it's maintenance and therefore the clerk was asked to take this project forward with the proper authorities. The long awaited repairs to the church wall have been completed during August and the water leak at North End had been repaired. A letter had been received raising the issue of too much grass-cutting effecting wildlife and flora and fora. It was agreed that the intention was to encourage village homeowners to sympathetically cut their own grass verge but it was agreed that they should be conscious of biodiversity issues in doing so.

Six planning applications were considered from across the parish council area including farms and cottages. As usual the minutes of meetings are posted on the www.osmotherley.org.uk website following approval (normally one month later).
