Caring for the Moors with the National Trust

The Sheepwash area of the North York Moors is a fantastic place both for people and wildlife. Right on the doorstep for Osmotherley residents it's perfect whether you're a picnicker, dog walker, rambler or cyclist. As one of the major land owners in the area, the National Trust has the challenge of trying to balance the desires and need of our many visitors with the need to protect an area that is an important and fragile wildlife habitat.

The popularity of Sheepwash can be both a positive and negative thing for wildlife conservation. Some of our less considerate visitors create a huge quantity of litter, especially during the summer. Fortunately there is a band of local people who are out volunteering every day with their litter pickers so the area is usually spotless whenever I am there. We also have volunteers to thank, for Cod Beck Reservoir having one of the healthiest toad populations in the country. A small band of volunteers are out on suitable nights during the spring helping toads cross the roads so they don't get run over before they have the chance to breed.

At the moment we have a problem that has been caused by local mountain bikers. They have taken it upon themselves to dig tracks and build a series of jumps in an old quarry on the moor opposite Cod Beck Reservoir. Aside from not asking our permission as land owners, the major problem with this is that the area has special protection as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). This is in place because the area has a high number of rare species. Through this protection Natural England can prosecute any individual who 'intentionally or recklessly damages or destroys any of the features of special interest of an SSSI, or disturbs wildlife for which the site was notified' with fines of up to $\pounds 20,000$.

With such protection in place it is very much in the interest of the mountain bikers own interest to stop what they are doing. - Continued on page 2



Parish Council

The first item on the agenda of the Osmotherley Area Parish Councils March meeting was a report from the Police giving details of a local break-in and theft as well as a reported auto crime. An accident had occurred on South End resulting in 3 cars sustaining considerable damage but there were no reports of serious injury to the occupants.

Dog fouling is again becoming a serious problem. This is antisocial behaviour of a despicable nature, in many instances the dog owners pick up after the pet yet proceed to throw the bag into the verge or into a hedge. Please can someone take a photo and then action could be taken against the offender or offenders. There will soon be more livestock in the fields and animals should not be put at risk from either dog mess or from plastic bags.

Following the well-attended marathon a few weeks ago a protocol is to be drawn up alongside the Village Hall Committee to ensure that any event organiser is aware of the needs of the village as well as being registered to hold such an event.

The loose setts at the Cross need to be rebedded and Highways will be asked to carry out this work as well as similar at the layby near to Beech Hill farm on the A684. Highways will also be asked to effect a lasting repair to Foxton Lane following severe erosion after the wet winter.

Compliments were made regarding the excellent work to rebuild a wall off Back Lane, both a credit to the builder, the owner and as an entrance for walkers arriving from the Cleveland Way.

Comments have been received about the revised bus schedules and the relevant department at County Hall has now been tasked to consider allowing time for patients to access the Doctors Surgeries as well as the provision of transport bearing in mind that many who would use this service are not fully mobile and need this assistance.

Although I do not know exactly who is responsible I am aware that some of the people involved are local residents. I am therefore hoping that this article will help get the message to them. In the meantime, I will once again be relying on volunteers to help remove the tracks that have been created so far and restore the area as much as is possible.

The National Trust do not seek to stop people enjoying the outdoors in their own way. In fact I have recently been involved in creating a downhill mountain bike course at another of our sites where we have a suitable area. In general, it is best to stick to the rules though – cyclists and horse riders should not ride anywhere other than designated bridleways unless they have gained permission from the land owner first.

Yorkshire Water-Oakdale Reservoir

Daniella Munton, Community Engagement Advisor Yorkshire Water writes - Our contractors, Mott MacDonald Bentley, will carry out this work in two stages to avoid working during the shooting season.

The first stage will be from 31 March 2014 to 12 August 2014 and then work will recommence on 9 February 2015 until August 2015, when the work will be complete. This is dependent on weather conditions but we'll keep you updated.

We need to discontinue the reservoir to ensure reservoir safety recommendations are met under the Reservoirs Act 1975. We'll significantly lower the overflow weir level by excavating a hole through the embankment and constructing a new raw water channel through the centre.

After the works are complete, a reduced body of water will remain. The site will be then landscaped and the existing spillway will be backfilled.

The Cleveland Way National Trail that runs alongside Oakdale upper reservoir will not be affected. There may be an increase in traffic volumes for the duration of the works but this will be kept to a minimum through Osmotherley.
