Parish Council

Much of the June meeting of the Parish Council was taken up discussing various drainage issues in and around the villages. Several times in recent months Highways have been alerted to areas where water pools on roads, and very little action has resulted, so much so that members expressed grave frustration as to the efficiency of that organisation. A new housing development is going up on Clack Lane and recent survey activity indicated that a culvert under the road along with a section of roadside drain is silted up and Members and residents are concerned that this should be put right without further delay. Water pooling on the road out of Thimbleby and a piped drain on the West Harlsey road, were added to the list of tasks for Highways to attend to.

To commemorate the Queens Jubilee the PC have agreed to give funds to the Gardening Club who will plant white flowering bulbs in various suitable locations later this year with these bulbs first flowering next spring. The Club have in the past promoted many initiatives in the area to make visual improvements and this new project is applauded.

Dog fouling is again a problem as well as an anti-social activity and owners are reminded to be more considerate of their actions. Some footpaths are becoming well overgrown and these will be strimmed to make it easier to walk them and to present a more cared for look, particularly for those visitors approaching from the Cleveland Way path.

The Police reported a drop in anti-social activity around Codbeck, partly due to the weather of late but they intend to patrol that area more frequently and in particular to advise members of the public to ensure that any valuables left in vehicles are out of sight.

Affordable Housing-Clack Lane

Broadacres have agreed that the local community should have the opportunity to suggest names for the new "street", "court" or "square", e.g.: "Albert Square", "Victoria Embankment" or "Jubilee Court"! All residents are invited to send suggestions by email to the Clerk to the Parish Council (Len Cragg [lencragg@hotmail.com]) by no later than 17th July (the next Parish Council meeting).

The PC will then choose three names, in order of preference, and send them to Broadacres and Hambleton Council for vetting - e.g. to make sure no similar names exist in the area, or there are no prohibited names (Windsor Court would not be acceptable because it implies a connection with the Royal family, but Winsor Court would be!) and consultation with the Post Office (for a postcode). They will then make a final choice.

Osmotherley and Area Oil Coop

The Cooperative has now saved villagers a total of £13,000.

The May order reached 53,000 litres of oil and now benefits households in Swainby, Borrowby, Knayton, East Harlsey, Ingleby Arncliffe as well as Osmotherley. By pooling our requirements we are able to negotiate a lower price for oil – previous orders have been 2-5p per litre lower than prices offered to individual customers. This provides a saving of up to \pounds 70 a tank.

Every other month the Cooperative Coordinator emails members asking for order amounts. The coordinator negotiates with various companies for prices based on the total volume, and places the order. The oil is delivered on agreed days, and the supplier leaves or sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier from the member within two weeks by cheque or credit card. **Members only order when oil is required – they don't have to order oil each time.**

The next orders will be placed on 26th July and 27th September 2012.

Friends of Chernobyl's Children (Northallerton and surrounding areas) is a registered charity devoting its energies to raising funds to bring disadvantaged children from Belarus to Northallerton for a four week recuperative visit each year to boost the children's immunity and provide a brief respite from their on-going exposure to radiation caused by the Chernobyl nuclear disaster of 26 years ago. By extensive fundraising and donations, the charity meets the costs of these visits. The charity is run completely by volunteers

who give their time and talents freely, thus ensuring that all money raised directly benefits the children. The children, aged 7-12, are placed with local host families who provide a friendly, stable home, nourishing food and lots of loving care. The charity also organises a daily programme of activities for the children during weekdays.

DAFFODILS IN THE VILLAGE

This year, the daffodils were late coming into bloom and lasted longer because it has been so cold, which means that the leaves had not yet died down. This may look unsightly for a short time but unless the leaves are allowed to die down naturally, next year's bulbs will not be fed which weakens the bulb and will result in no flowers over the next year or two.

PLEASE, will anyone who has daffodils on the verges outside their houses which you would normally mow, leave the grass for a bit longer and give the bulbs a chance. It is now too late to save most of the daffodil leaves for this year, as the NYCC has already been round and done the damage.

Everyone enjoys this bright splash of yellow in the Spring and the bulbs were planted by many helpers in the village and we don't want to see our efforts go to waste.
