Flooding and water problems have exercised many minds recently, involving actions from many agencies. The water supply failures of the past should soon be resolved because Yorkshire Water are due to install a backup generator to supply energy should the mains electricity supply fail again. A few residents have been involved in this fight with YW, so thanks for all their efforts.

Flash flooding has caused grief to many and although severe storms cannot be controlled, it is important agencies to ensure drains are capable of removing water as quickly as it falls. Highways are responsible for this and the PC will continue to chase them until all outstanding matters have been resolved. Several footbridges on the Codbeck were damaged as well as the Sheep Wash stepping stones and the authorities will be asked to make speedy repairs to these.

After installing an honesty box at the Toilets about £10.00 is collected every week, at least this will pay for some but not all of the upkeep of this village facility. Recent expenditure has seen the retaining wall at South End rebuilt and also further pointing and repairs to the Cemetery walls as well as installing stronger bollards on North End.

Keith Henderson continues to keep the area looking very tidy. Please can those householders who cut their own grass ensure that the clippings do not go onto the road and into the drains which could cause blockages. On a similar theme if your vehicle is parked preventing the Highways road-sweeper clearing loose chippings it would be appreciated if you were able to tidy up yourself.

Highways have undertaken a comprehensive review of all Traffic Regulation Orders within the County. This involves additions and changes to some of the no waiting zones within Osmotherley as well as elsewhere. Those in Osmotherley affect both sides of North End, full details of these proposed schedules can be viewed on their website (www.northyorks.gov.uk) or at any Library. Any responses must be back to Highways before the 11th September.

Village Hall

Well, as summer (hmmm?) begins to draw to a close, hopefully we can all look forward to warmer, less draughty accommodation in the Village Hall. Work on improving the heating and insulation was paused for further consultation, but is now scheduled to start on 23rd September. The work will modernise existing heaters, add infra-red heaters to boost the temperature quickly when needed, and will provide heating in all compartments of the building (which is not currently the case). All this will be achieved with a reduction in the carbon footprint of the building, due to efficiency gains – can't be bad. It is anticipated that there will be an inevitable disruption to service for a brief time whilst the work is on-going, for which we apologise, but it will be worth it.

On behalf of all Village Hall committee members, we would like to extend a huge thank you to the probation service and Simon Cross for their splendid efforts in repainting the hall. Thanks also to Ellen Cross for her tremendous efforts in procuring grant funding to refurbish the kitchen/kitchen area of the supper room – work on this is anticipated to be completed by the end of the year, but more news to follow.

So, a rosier future is in prospect for all users of the Village Hall – thanks as ever for your support.

Improving the Access at St.Peter's Church

The path and the porch steps at St. Peter's Church have been tricky for a number of years and now we plan to improve the access. This takes into account some recent changes in the regulations relating to disabled access and it will benefit everyone. The plans show the changes in detail but basically the steps will be moved about two metres towards the gate and will have a handrail. A larger paved area will be created

outside the porch and will extend smoothly into church. Thus anyone coming to Church from West End along the path through the churchyard, either on foot, in a wheelchair, or with a child in a buggy or pram, will have no steps to negotiate. The paved area outside the porch will make turning in and out of church straightforward. As the church is several feet above School Lane finding a satisfactory solution has been

quite a puzzle and because we are a listed building within the National Park it is not going to be cheap – estimates of cost are in the region of £15,000. Grants have been applied for and some money has already been raised as follows:
