Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Sunday this year falls on 11th November, 94 years to the day after the guns fell silent at the end of World War I, 11am on 11th November 1918. The usual parade of veterans will take place commencing at 10:50am. The Act of Remembrance at the War

Memorial will be supported by the Silver Jubilee Band and include wreath laying on behalf of the parish Council. Children from Osmotherley School will lay posies of poppies which they will have made themselves. To allow this event to go ahead unhindered, the centre of the village will be closed to traffic from 10:45 to 11:15am and diversions will be in place via School Lane and Back Lane. Residents who normally park their cars around the immediate area of the War Memorial are asked to move their cars just for the duration of the parade.

Parish Council

Once again the effects of large volumes of water swamping much of the area and its effects on residents was debated. Where this involves either roadside gulleys or ditches Highways are always asked to act but frequently they fail to tackle to source of the problem. Cuddy Lane, Oswaldene and the Pied Piper are new locations and these as well as the blocked gulleys have all been flagged up for Highways attention.

The recent house naming exercise for the new development on Clack Lane was well attended and special credit must go to the School and its pupils for their involvement. All of these dwellings at Westfields will now have a unique name thanks to this initiative.

The public conveniences are being well cared for and the Honesty box is a welcome addition to the revenue needed to maintain this facility. Water in an unheated building can present problems in cold weather and in the light of this experience it may be necessary to make some changes to the supply but there is no intention to allow these toilets to close.

Highways recently decided to change the parking restrictions on North End without prior consultation. They have been called to task and the double lines will be reinstated and this will permit parking on the verge outside the shop provided that it is safe to do so and will still allow parking all the way along the other side of the road.

Osmotherley Oil

Are you interested in joining to save money on heating oil?

The September order reached 65,000 litres of oil and now benefits 230 households in Swainby, Borrowby, Knayton, Over Silton, East Harlsey, Ingleby Arncliffe, Ingleby Cross as well as Osmotherley.

By pooling our requirements we are able to negotiate a lower price for oil – previous orders have been 2-5p per litre lower than prices offered to individual customers. This provides a saving of up to f.70 a tank

How does it work?

Every other month the Cooperative Coordinator emails members asking for order amounts. The coordinator negotiates with various companies for prices based on the total volume, and places the order. The oil is delivered on agreed days, and the supplier sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier from

the member within two weeks by cheque or credit card. Members only order when oil is required, they don't have to order oil each time.

Osmotherley Community Mini-bus

A new 17 seater mini-bus has been obtained for use by the local community. To oversee and supervise the use of the mini-bus, a User Group has been formed with David Black as chairman, Vice -chairman will be provided by Osmotherley School, Bookings Secretary James Downey, Secretary Tim Swales. Bus key holders are James Downey, Osmotherley School and Tim Swales Garage.

At present, designated users are Osmotherley and Swainby Schools, Osmotherley Royal British Legion, OWLS, Youth Club, Football Club, Cricket Club, Pre-School, Osmotherley Community Trust, Village Hall, Osmotherley Agricultural Show, Summer Games Committee and Broadacres Group.

The terms under which the min-bus has been granted require that it be used exclusively for community purposes with designated users listed. Any group or organisation within Osmotherley district can apply to join the user group but must have a designated driver (s) who must be in possession of a driver's license endorsed with validity to drive a mini-bus AND a MIDAS certificate issued by the Community Transport Association UK. The User Group will assist those wishing to obtain a MIDAS Certificate.

We are still working out the detailed modus operandi of the Group and will keep you informed through the pages of "The Messenger". In the meantime if anyone has any queries or would like further information, please contact any member of the Users Group."
