### **Parish Council**

Osmotherley Area Parish Council held its Annual Assembly during the last week of May to which representative of Highways and the National Park were invited. Mr Nigel Smith of Highways was asked to tackle the question of winter road treatment and the condition of road surfaces following the prolonged spell of frost and snow. He explained how it had not been possible to carry out treatment to all roads all the time because resources were fully stretched and finances do not run to the levels that many rate payers might expect. He stated that lessons had been learnt from this and that they are already preparing for next winter by starting to stockpile salt and also by carrying out consultations with all who wished to put forward ideas and constructive comment to try to ensure that services can be maintained and as many situations as possible will be accommodated. He also stated that repairs to potholes and other surface erosion would cost well in excess of the previously budgeted figure but all work would be considered with due priority.

Road safety is an important issue and many residents spoke of particular concerns, all of which were noted and will be followed up. These included the current use of the Bullamoor to Jeator Houses road as a rat run and also safety concerns on the A684 from Ellerbeck and though Winton which suffers from frequent accidents and blockages. North End is frequently obstructed by parked vehicles impeding emergency vehicles and it is hoped that the Police will make this a higher priority. Speeding in Osmotherley is also seen as needing to be curbed, perhaps more hens may be the answer here.

Mr Chris France, the newly appointed Director of Planning at the National Park Authority spoke and admitted that there is no such thing as a one view suits all applications and that he will consider the specific needs of localities where planning and other considerations need to be determined. He welcomed the production of the Village Design Statement and indicated that it is to be considered in its present form at the next park planning committee meeting before going forward for public consultation. The Chairman, Mr Noel Coward thanked all who had been involved in the development of the VDS document.

The Cemetery has now been handed over to parish control and the day to day running will fall to a small number of Parish Councillors. Di Swales has been appointed as Burials Clerk and all requests for services will need to be forwarded to her either by phone (883320) or in writing at 32 South End. It is the intention to carry out repairs to the walls and tender prices will be obtained to ensure that this work proceeds satisfactorily, that the current spoil heaps left from past burials are removed and that the path at the top side is removed to permit spaces to be used along that side. A major concern is that many of the memorials are unsafe, some have already needed to be laid over and all now wish to see relatives of the deceased carry out repairs to their graves to ensure that no accidents occur at any time. Please let us know in advance because there is a desire to ensure consistency of workmanship and materials used for both repairs as well as for future designs.

### Osmotherley Village Theatre

Readers of the Messenger and observant people in the village would have been aware that the OSMOTHERLEY VILLAGE THEATRE put on a production of two oneact plays in the Village Hall from the 19th to the 22nd May. Those who came thoroughly enjoyed the evening but attendance was very poor indeed. We averaged only about 25 people per night.

When the Parish Plan survey was collated, a large number

of respondents said that they would like to see the return of the Village Theatre. WELL, HERE IT IS! We know that everyone is busy these days and other things sometimes get in the way and we also know that amateur dramatics (even something as good as the OVT) is not everyone's idea of a good evening out; but we cannot continue to produce plays without an audience to support us.

It takes 8-10 weeks to rehearse a play; costumes have

to be made or borrowed; performance licences have to be paid (can be up to £270 for 3 nights); add to that the cost of making the set and paying for the hire of the hall and you will see that the costs can be considerable.

In the hope that the Village Theatre can continue after all the hard work to get it going again, a questionnaire has been inserted into the Messenger and it would be very helpful indeed if you would take the time to complete it and return it to one of the points indicated or hand it to any member of the theatre. We don't want to see the decline of live theatre in Osmotherley again but as they say – "Use it. or Lose it."

Please tell us what you would like to see – or even tell us that you have no interest whatsoever. Any feedback will be helpful. We look forward to hearing from you.

The Osmotherley area has free use of a selection of bicycles and extras. Borrowers are just requested to carry out any maintenance they find necessary and to collect from Back Lane unless noted otherwise. None of the bikes are suitable for rough terrain.

Tandem - suitable for two

adults or older child. Efficient and easy to ride if at the rear, but takes some practice on the front.

Electric bike – easy ride to Northallerton and back (40 minute each way) or further. It takes the effort out of up-hill cycling and no licence required.

Folding bike – very useful

around town or to take on the train. Kept at South Parade close to Northallerton railway

Tag along – two available but one needs attention. Allows a child peddling along.

Trailer – useful for shopping and medium weight loads.

Cricket equipment for young people is also available. This includes a variety of cricket balls from plastic to leather, wicket keeping and batting equipment (gloves, pads and bats) for 8 year olds upwards.

### Village Design Statement

The Village Design Group has been working on a Village Design Statement (VDS) for Osmotherley and Thimbleby since 2007. The VDS describes the distinctive character and surroundings of Osmotherley and Thimbleby and includes guidelines for future development based on an assessment of their character. It is hoped that the VDS will be used by residents, businesses and organizations when considering alterations to buildings, new buildings or services in and around the villages. The intention is that the document will be adopted as a Supplementary Planning Document by the National Park Authority and

become part of the Local Development Framework. This would mean that the guidelines in the document are a material consideration when planning applications are decided.

The Design Group consulted residents on an initial draft of the VDS during November 2009 and has now produced a final version of the draft document. A formal period of consultation is being arranged by the National Park Authority in order to enable the document to be adopted as a Supplementary Planning Document and this will run from 5th July to 16th August 2010. It is not intended to circulate a copy to each household but

copies of the draft document will be available for inspection at the Top Shop, from the Parish Council or at the Authority's offices in Helmsley and can also be viewed on the Authority's web site

www.northyorkmoors.org in the Planning section. Comments on the draft document can be made by letter, on the comments form copies of which will also be available at the Top Shop, or by email to policy@northyorkmoors.org and must be received by 16th August 2010.
