Parish Council

The November meeting of Osmotherley Area Parish Council was held at Kirby Sigston continuing the theme of taking the meeting to the outlying parishes. The only item directly affecting that part of the world concerned the recent resurfacing of Chester Lane and the condition of the verges which are deemed to be unsafe. Highways will be asked to attend to this and also to further consider a water leak in Thimbleby as well as replacing white lining in Osmotherley

Bollards have been purchased and these will soon be installed on North End to try to deter vehicles using the footpath; this is a safety feature for the benefit of all users. Work will soon be undertaken to remedy the overhang of trees on the village greens, road or footpaths. Once approval has been granted from the Woodlands Officer at Helmsley, parking arrangements will be made to allow the work to be completed.

Following a series of thefts of diesel from household tanks and from vehicles the Police have arrested 3 persons and these enquiries will continue, as with any similar incident prompt reporting is essential, ring them on 0845 60 60 247 with the full details.

There have not been any recent planning applications but approvals have been given to the construction of an all weather horse gallop at Trenholme House, for continued opening hours at the Clay Target Centre, to alter the Walking Shop to include the sale of refreshments and to replace windows in the listed Stank Hall. This latter application took over 6 months to resolve despite the fact that the windows to be removed were 20th century and not those installed when the hall was built in the 16th century.

a free survey for you. Even if you have more than 2.4" of loft insulation but would like a top-up, you are entitled to a discounted price. And since Osmotherley is a 'Sustainable Community', a further 50% can be cut off the price. Please call the Energy Saving Trust to arrange a free survey on 0800 512 012.

Stone Cavities

Osmotherley residents can have £500 off the cost of filling the stone-faced cavity walls with polybead insulation. Please ring Energy Saving Trust advice centre for some installers' telephone numbers to arrange a free survey.

Affordable Housing consultation event

Those who came to the consultation and saw the designs and layout of the 12 properties, were asked to give their comments. Broadacres have collated the comments received and will be amending the design to meet as many of

the requests as possible. A planning application is due to be submitted before Christmas and if approved building work should commence in early summer 2012 with properties ready for occupation in Summer 2013.

Are you interested in saving money on heating oil?

The Oil Cooperative for Osmotherley and surrounding villages has now nearly 150 members; the September order reached 65,000 litres!!!! By pooling our requirements we are able to negotiate a lower price for oil, for example previous order prices compared as shown:

How does it work?

The Cooperative coordinator emails existing members to let them know when the next order will be. Members let the coordinator know how much oil they want.

The coordinator phones round various companies for prices based on the total volume, and places the order.

The oil is delivered on an agreed day or days, and the supplier leaves or sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier within two weeks by cheque or credit card. The Cooperatives DO NOT HANDLE ANY MONEY

If you don't have email then ask someone with email to 'buddy up' with you so they can email the Coordinator on your behalf. There is an order every couple of months, so the chances of running short are limited.

Members are under no obligation to order each time the orders are made.
