Oil For Osmotherley

Come along to the launch of our new 'Oil Club'.

Many householders living in Osmotherley and the surrounding areas rely on oil for both heating and hot water – which is much more expensive than using the mains gas supply.

Filling a tank with oil usually costs between £500 and £600, but this can rise dramatically during the colder months: over Christmas 2010 the cost for some households rose to almost 90p per litre – that's

£900 to fill up a 1000 litre tank.

Residents in Osmotherley are joining forces with Hambleton District Council, Yorkshire Energy Partnership and the North Yorkshire Credit Union to drive down these costs and, following a popular 'Energy Day' held in the Village Hall last month, we now have 25 local people looking to launch an oilbuying club – cutting costs for everyone involved.

Parish Council

Osmotherley Area Parish Council met with representatives of the YHA because a proposal has been made to close the Hostel at Cote Ghyll which is currently only operating at 33% of its capacity. As well as these low attendance figures the property is in need of a major refurbishment in order for it to become more attractive and this coupled with a need to draw in organised groups of either adults or students means that the facility faces an uphill task. Members did not feel that they could make any immediate recommendation but will give this further consideration at the May meeting. The Police report indicated that thefts of diesel, sheep, garden items and now lead from roofs remain a serious problem and everyone is urged to report any suspicious activity as soon as it is noticed. There has been a good response to a recent appeal for Neighbourhood Watch personnel and this may help to reduce some of the crimes currently being committed. Country Watch is being reorganised and volunteers from the more rural areas are needed to ensure the success of this scheme.

Highways concerns remain high on the agenda and there is still much work to be done to restore damage from the last winter. This now also includes many gulleys, particularly on North End as well as much of the rural road network, all of which need to be repaired. As well as potholes the dry weather has shown up where the water leaks are and these have once again been passed to highways for action.

Hambleton District Council have entered into negotiations to hand over the running of the public toilets to the Parish Council. In turn the PC has been in discussion with the Village Hall and an arrangement has now been formally agreed whereby these will transfer to become a village asset with a degree of funding being released to facilitate this. The Pound on North End is to be re-instated to its former historic condition and it has now been confirmed that work will be carried out by a contractor approved by and paid by the National Park to carry out this work to the required standards.

Next month will see elections in some areas for new Parish and District Councillors. The last PC meeting saw the resignation of two longstanding and valued representatives— Anne Abbott and Shirley Kirk— who between them had put in 32 years of service as Parish Councillors. Their decisions to step down were marked with a tribute to their hard work and dedication.
