Parish Council

The January meeting of the PC considered several maintenance issues and also several planning applications as well as concerns regarding the condition of some areas of the public highways. Correspondence has been received regarding surface conditions particularly at the exit of Ruebury Lane onto North End, however it must be pointed out that the lane is not an adopted highway and as such even NYCC Highways have limited scope to tackle problems in this regard.

A planning application has been submitted for 12 affordable 2 storey dwellings off Clack Lane opposite The Cemetery and although Members were in agreement that this scheme should proceed several design points were raised. These included a condition that all walls should be of either stone (locally sourced and not from the Dales) or of brick and that the use of timber cladding should be avoided and not be a visible feature of the works. The Village Design Statement was clear in that roofs should be of a certain material and this detail has been included in the submission for any approval. Landscaping and hedge maintenance was also discussed to help to screen the site and it was Members' opinion that conditions should be attached to the scheme. It should be noted that many Members do, from time to time, need to express an interest when applications are discussed and these are recorded as such in the minutes where appropriate.

Other plans forward included extensions to Westfields Farm, Woodcroft and a property on Back Lane, all were supported with conditions. Works are proposed to a property on North End and this was again supported as was an application to construct an enclosed swimming pool to a property in Kirby Sigston.

Maintenance issues commented on the current preparations for snow and that the salt bins would now be filled by the parish and not by Highways. Tree works have been completed to a good standard and the same contractor would be appointed should any need arise in the future. Many of the seats and benches are in need of repair and it is to be hoped that a good Samaritan from the area may step forward to carry out any repairs needed, just ask any Parish Councillor for details.

A tender exercise is to go out seeking suitable contractors to rebuild the low retaining wall on the southern side of South End. Again on South End it was reported that a chimney at a property appears to be in an unsafe condition and the opinion of Building Control is to be sought before any action can be taken. A property adjoining Winton Bank has recently changed ownership and HGVs are being kept there and damage is being caused to the grass verges. This matter will be taken up with Highways as well as with the District Council.

Osmotherley and Area Oil Cooperative

Are you interested in saving money on heating oil? The Oil Cooperative for Osmotherley and surrounding villages has now nearly reached 200 members. By pooling our requirements we are able to negotiate a lower price for oil – previous orders have been 3-5p per litre lower than prices offered to individual

customers.

How does it work?

Every other month the Cooperative Coordinator emails members asking for order amounts. The coordinator phones round various companies for prices based on the total volume, and places the

order. The oil is delivered on an agreed day or days, and the supplier leaves or sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier within two weeks by cheque or credit card.

Members only order when oil is required – they don't have to order oil each time.

The next orders will be placed on 29th March, 31st May, 26th July and 27th Sept 2012.
