Toad Patrol

Every Spring since 2002 a patrol has been organised to save toads, frogs and newts from being run over by traffic on the road near Sheepwash. The task involves picking up the toads from the road surface or verges, putting them in a bucket and releasing them into Cod Beck reservoir when the bucket is full. There's about a mile and a half of road to patrol so help is always welcome. Warm clothing, good shoes or wellies, a reflective hi-vis jacket, a bucket and a good torch are the equipment required. We

have a few hi-vis jackets that can be borrowed for the evening if you don't have your own.

Patrols generally happen from about mid-March when the weather is mildish (above about 8C) and toads' movements usually start at dusk. If it's wet as well as mild then several hundred toads may appear over a couple of hours. A typical season may last until Easter but timings are very weather dependent. Last year we helped over 2,300 toads, 70 frogs and 30 newts. By reading some safety literature and a risk assessment and signing a couple of forms we can arrange free third party

and personal accident insurance while patrolling thanks to the charity Froglife. Otherwise, all patrols are carried out strictly at your own risk. Parents or guardians need to sign the forms on behalf of anyone under 18 years old. The task is not really suitable for very young children. However, we are considering arranging something with Osmotherley School so that they can experience the fun of a patrol under strict one-to-one parent and/or teacher supervision. Parish Council

The Police attended the Feb meeting of the Parish Council – there had been no reported incidents in the area during the previous 4 weeks. However PC Woodcock was able to respond to concerns following the serious congestion resulting from a well attended running event based in the village. The advice here is that organisers of such events must always seek prior approval from the Police and that should any third party become aware it is advisable that such information is forwarded to the Police. Police are also running campaigns to make youngsters in particular, aware of the dangers of legal highs and of "sexting". Other campaigns that are current are pet theft, a growing problem in some areas; it is confirmed that poaching should be notified by the use of a 999 call.

The road past Sheepwash is soon to be closed to help prevent further flooding in that area and Yorkshire Water has been asked to tackle various leaks elsewhere. However they have responded to say that the chamber near the Pinfold is not their responsibility despite it being a part of the old Dales and District Water Boards pipework. The PC will continue to press for a solution to this problem.

Work to repair the Bus Shelter will be carried out in the near future but the repointing to the Churchyard wall cannot take place until a Church Faculty has been obtained. Further quotes are still to come in to refurbish the Toilets and here the PC will try to find an additional source of funding to cover the costs. Second quotes are waited for the inscriptions to the War memorial and to replace the Ellerbeck sign on the A684.

Parliamentary, District and Parish Elections will be held on May 7th. All Councillors are obliged to step down and if they wish to seek re-election they must complete the nomination process. Nomination forms for Parish Councillors will be available from the Clerk, Len Cragg, 01609 773577 from 14th of March. Anyone wanting a form is asked to phone near to that date and one will be forwarded. Once received the timescale for completion and return must be carefully followed as indicated in the pack. Also please make sure that your name is on the Official List of Electors, since without that you will not be eligible to vote.

Osmotherley and Area Oil Cooperative

The Cooperative now benefits over 250 households in Swainby, Borrowby, Knayton, Over Silton, East Harlsey, Ingleby Arncliffe, Ingleby Cross as well as Osmotherley. By pooling our requirements we are able to negotiate a lower price for oil – previous orders have been 3-7p per litre lower than prices offered to individual customers.

Every other month the Cooperative Coordinator emails members asking for order amounts. The coordinator negotiates with various companies for prices based on the total volume and places the order. The oil is delivered on agreed days, and the supplier sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier from the member within two weeks by cheque or credit card. Members only order when oil is required – they don't have to order oil each time. The next order will be placed at the end of March and then every other month.

News from St Peter's

we shall celebrate Mothering Sunday – a joyful occasion with poses for Mums and Honorary Aunties.

Royal British Legion

The Osmotherley branch has unanimously elected as their President, a former Royal Air Force Officer who piloted a Lancaster bomber on the final raid of the Second World War. Osmotherley resident Ken Baker, a spritely ninety-one year old, considers his good health is thanks to his personal trainer, Toby, a Staffordshire terrier cross who exercises Ken twice a day.

A keen member of the Air Training Corps, Ken volunteered for the RAF on reaching 18 and was selected for flying training which was undertaken in

Canada. Once trained as a Pilot, Ken returned to England for conversion to heavy aircraft and qualified to fly Lancaster bombers. In February 1945, as part of 106 Squadron RAF, Ken flew the first of four operational raids into Germany. His fifth raid was to Tonsberg in Norway, which was to be Bomber Command's final operational European raid in the Second World War. On demobilisation in 1946 he commenced a long career in agricultural, particularly crop research and development. Since settling into Osmotherley Ken has been a stalwart of the lively village



branch of the Royal British Legion. Branch Chairman David Black is delighted that a Second World War veteran has accepted the Presidential post.
