# Parish Council

Highway concerns continue to be one of the dominant issues for Osmotherley Area Parish Council. A private contractor was brought in to try to find the cause of the North End waterfall after Highways had failed to achieve a result. The problem appears to be due in part to tree roots blocking an outfall pipe but also to a collapsed fire hydrant junction; both of these will now be repaired. Potholes need filling in many locations – the public can report these directly by accessing the NYCC website and going to *reportapothole*.

Planning applications included proposals to erect an eco house in the quarry along Quarry Lane; this was considered to be entirely unsuitable both in terms of its location as well as the proposal to create a smallholding to make it self-sufficient, and the PC recommended that it should be refused. Another application was for three cattle buildings and a silage clamp at Home Farm: this included a landscape plan so that these new buildings would be screened from both the road as well as from Thimbleby. Also in Thimbleby was an application for an array of solar panels; no objections were made because these will be hidden from view at the rear of the property.

Although the police did not attend the meeting their report was considered to be inaccurate because it did not include the theft of a car from outside Keepers Cottage. Nor did it refer to the theft of a teleporter from within the Shooting Ground. After this vehicle was crashed the police did make two arrests and these persons are now on bail. Because there is unease about security of property and to individuals, the police have been asked to attend the next meeting with a view to them advising and highlighting ways of cascading information as soon as an incident occurs. Prevention is always better as a cure.

A second training session can be arranged to give people the confidence to use the defibrillator. This session will be carried out by the Ambulance Service and could be combined with residents of other villages who have expressed an interest in refresher training. Please can anyone who is interested let any Parish Councillor know.

Osmotherley Parish Council would like to thank Mr Len Cragg for more than 12 years of loyal service to the villages of Osmotherley, Thimbleby, Ellerbeck, Kirby Sigston, West Harlsey, Winton, Foxton, Stank, Sowerby under Cotcliffe and Hallikeld. All of these settlements are represented by the Osmotherley Parish Council and, as you can see, covers a wide area.

Len has always gone the extra mile to make sure that all his work benefits our residents with regular contact with the North York Moors National Parks, North Yorkshire County Council, Hambleton District Council, Yorkshire Water and local business etc. We wish him every success for his future endeavours.

To put the record straight: The Top Shop (and flat) is up for sale as a going concern but I have no intention of closing it. Myself, Gail & Wendy look forward to continuing to serve the community for 362 days a year.

# Royal British Legion

The Osmotherley Branch of the Legion would like to thank you for all the support you have given to us over the past few years - and hope you will continue to do in the future. We were particularly pleased with the wonderful turnout especially the children on Remembrance Sunday this year when despite the weather, so many villagers were there to help us mark the Act of Remembrance and church service. We are a small branch with some 60 members but we do our best to further the Legion's welfare work. From our bingo evenings and stalls at Summer Games and the Agricultural Show (and other events) we have since 2001 been able to donate over £36,000 to local Legion charitable work, notably giving over £27,000 to the Legion's residential care home at Lister House in Ripon and £6,000 to Alderson House, the respite care home in Bridlington. In addition some £3,000 has gone to individual welfare cases in our district. This amount is quite separate from that which we raise over the annual Poppy Appeal for which during the 5 years from 2000 to 2014 we raised £49, 744. All this is due to the support we get from the village and district and we are very, very grateful to you.
