## **Parish Council**

The July meeting of Osmotherley Area Parish Council heard that the Village Design Statement is almost at the public consultation stage and following that it is to be hoped that it will be adopted by the National Park to form a part of its planning process. This will be most welcome because currently there have been several inconsistencies in planning approvals, particularly concerning applications where plastic type windows and rainwater goods have been permitted and other instances where they have been refused.

The Police report indicated that there have been several thefts of fuel from parked vehicles, mainly from HGVs parked overnight near the A19. Other thefts have involved tools being taken from outbuildings, should anyone see any suspicious activity please phone the Police without delay, they can only act if the incident is happening. The Police have also had to become involved with inconsiderate parking and actually had to issue tickets where motorists had parked on the coned off no waiting area in the centre of the Village on Summer Games day. Consideration has been given to using yellow lines to try to stop vehicle parking near the reservoir but Highways considered that the road surface along Quarry Lane is so poor that the lines would not remain intact and therefore they would then not be enforceable.

The control of dogs is becoming an issue and owners are reminded that they should clear up any mess, wherever, whenever, this also is a concern where grass cutting is being carried out and having to leave some areas uncut should not be an option. It was reported that in some areas vegetation and branches from gardens was overhanging footpaths and this should always be cut back by the householder and that it should not fall on the Parish Council to tidy up what is in effect the responsibility of the owner.
