A DRAMATIC LATE WINNER FROM MATTHEW MARSAY GAVE OSMOTHERLEY RANGERS THE SCORPION CUP AT NORTHALLERTON AS THE TOP TWO SIDES IN THE LEAGUE PLAYED OUT A THRILLING FINAL.

After leading scorer, Rich Thompson, had given Rangers an early lead, Sessay fought back to draw level in first half stoppage time with a penalty from Alex Fenwick.

Both sides had chances to win it in the second period before Marsay popped up in the 91st minute to give Rangers the trophy.

Manager, Ollie Watts, was delighted to have come out on top. He said: "It's unbelievable. Time was ticking away and I

could see it going to extra time and penalties again".

Rangers also have much still to play for. They are in the final of the League Challenge Cup and are currently top of their division. Their final match of the season is on May 8th 10.30am AWAY against Streetlam Farmers (field in Streetlam DL7 0HA).

Parish Council

The Parish Council Meeting held on the 21st April 2016 was attended by a majority of members together with a member of the public. A proposal to plant trees in the Osmotherley village area was presented and discussed. Although further discussion with nearby homeowners is required to progress, support in principle was given. Planting would be undertaken by the Osmotherley and District Garden Club in late autumn 2016 and further village consultation will take place throughout the summer. Tree surveys of all the trees in the village, including the churchyard, was discussed and approved to provide the council with professional information as to condition and future pruning requirements. It was agreed this would be undertaken at the earliest opportunity.

Concerns were expressed by members regarding the national park's planning consistency particularly concerning the use of wooden cladding and it was agreed to invite representatives to a future meeting of the Village Assembly. Also concerns were expressed over second home ownership in the village and this would be raised at the suggested Village Assembly meeting.

A survey of headstone condition will shortly be undertaken, crematoria remains and identification plaques will in future be placed along the front wall.

The toilets in the village hall are being repaired and the two boot scrapers outside of the village toilets will be replaced. Three planning applications were considered on Clack Lane and North End with no objections registered.

The next meeting of the council in May would also be it's Annual Meeting.
