Parish Council

The Parish Council Meeting on 19th May 2016 was attended by a majority of members and constitutionally was also the Annual Meeting. The current chairman, Mr Tim Swales, was re-elected for a further period of one year.

A report from an Arboricultural Safety Assessment of roadside Cherry on North End, Osmotherley, was received and discussed. It was agreed that permission was required from the supplier before being able to share the contents with the affected property.

A report from Smiths of Derby was received regarding St. Peter's Clock Tower and it was recommended that work be carried out to refurbish the clock face. It was agreed that grant support be sought to help fund this expensive restoration.

A suggestion had been received from a parishioner to further improve parish council electronic communications. It was agreed that the current arrangements were sufficient but that any proactive communication with the council was to be encouraged.

A planning application for a property on Back Lane was supported by the council.

Fly tipping in the parish was reported and members agreed to be vigilant and report any vehicles involved.

The date of the next parish council meeting is one week later on 23 June – NOT the usual third Thursday.

Village Hall – new chairs

As recent users of the Village Hall may have noticed, our new (and extra comfy!!) chairs have arrived. This is a great enhancement to our facilities and we hope all users will enjoy the added comfort – no need now to walk the village with a cushion!

The purchase of the new seating has been made possible through a combination of grant funding and matched funding by the Village Hall

Committee. A significant amount of effort has made this possible, from the preparation of the funding application through to the sourcing and selection of the chairs. The Village Hall Committee is grateful to those who have been involved.

Obviously, the purchase of the new seating is a significant investment for us. We ask all users to help us keep the chairs in tip-top condition so that they remain a benefit to all for many years to come.

To assist users, the chairs should be stacked no more than four high. Should there be any spillages on the chair upholstery, this should be cleaned with a damp cloth and warm/soapy water. We will be retaining a stock of the existing plastic chairs so we retain our licensed seating capacity. Please continue to use these chairs for any 'messy' events for which the upholstered seating may not be suitable.
