Osmotherley Village Theatre

The Osmotherley Village Theatre (OVT) returns to the Village Hall stage in November and December after a small sabbatical and comes back with a real festive cracker!!

From November 30th to December 2nd the OVT bring to the Stage 'The Flint Street Nativity', by Tim Firth, author of 'Neville's Island' which played to great acclaim in the Village hall a couple of years ago.

Plenty of familiar faces, with a couple of new members will tackle this complex, challenging, funny, warm, witty and moving play as Mizzis Horrock's class of seven

year olds are about to perform their nativity play at Flint Street Junior School for the proud mums and dads and the occasional social worker. Squabbles arise when Gabriel wants to play Mary, the Star grumbles he's not a proper star like they have at NASA, Herod won't stop waving to his mum and dad and the subversive Innkeeper is determined to liven up the traditional script. And then the stick insect escapes.

The children are played by adults, who later play their parents so the set changes accordingly to reflect the difference in scale. This warm, witty, funny play is an ideal alternative to the usual Christmas fare with original

lyrics set to the tunes of the usual Christmas carols. It was first performed to critical acclaim at the Liverpool Playhouse.

Parish Council

The last meeting of the PC on 17th Nov was attended by the majority of members and two residents. The public forum started with one of the residents asking the council to look into making the access road to the green behind the bus stop, more accessible and safer for the residents and whilst the topic of manorial land throughout the village comes up regularly on the agenda it was agreed to look into this issue further.

The Remembrance Service was well attended and the council wished to thank Col. Black for organising the day and to the knitters of the poppies which added an extra touching element to the event. NYCC are looking once again at the library service, including the mobile service which comes to the village. It has been noted that on average only 7 residents make use of the service however this number is unlikely to be enough to maintain it. Local book clubs are urged to help improve this number so basically use it or lose it! It is hoped that the village might increase its CCTV coverage around the Swainby area as more funds have become available to help fight rural crime. The Church clock face restoration has received church approval and will hopefully go ahead soon. A safety survey of the village graveyards has been undertaken and although the vast majority of gravestones are safe a small number will need to be re-seated and enquiries of specialists will hopefully lead to these being corrected soon. It was reported to last months meeting that the playground equipment and area would need some maintenance and quotations have been received by the PC for this to be undertaken, hopefully before Christmas. The North York Moors Local Plan had been discussed in detail by a small sub group of the PC and reported back to the full council on its recommendations for inclusion. The clerk was asked to complete the exercise as soon as possible.

The Osmotherley Community Forum, was held at St.Peters Church on the 3rd November, with speakers attending from the NPA to discuss planning matters. The meeting was well attended and items discussed were as follows: Church building improvements following the sale of Church House; The Gardening club proposals for tree planting was discussed and agreed that 10 wild pear trees would be planted on Clack Bank; The Community Group proposal for planters raised concerns from some villagers and ongoing maintenance would be an issue. Alternative ideas would potentially be provided; Silver Band recruitment for younger band members was discussed but no one could suggest suitable recruits; Footbridge development at Codbeck Reservoir and litter picking raised issues of dog fouling following the meeting; The Community Bus parking situation was discussed.

A proposal to locate a Christmas tree near the market cross with a permanent electric supply was raised and further discussion at the council meeting supported the proposal. A new provider of the tree itself needed to be sought and the clerk would contact Northern Power to check on the permanent solution to getting power to the market cross green.

Letters had been received asking that the PC support making the Coast to Coast walk into a national trail and also to improve the situation of dog fouling on or near the entrance to the Cleveland Way around Back Lane and both issues were supported. Three planning applications were received and supported. The accounts update was presented to the PC for consideration
