Parish Council Meeting - 20th July

Following the summer recess, the council met to pick up business from the previous period. A majority of members attended, with the meeting being chaired by the Vice Chairman in the absence of the Chairman. Recently elected councillor Mr Bob Manners was welcomed to his first official meeting.

A written report was provided by Stokesley Police and since our last meeting in July there had been 1 incident of anti-social behaviour, 2 auto crimes, 2 burglaries of dwellings and 1 incident of theft. The report also raised the issue of distraction burglary, whereby bogus callers pose as possible utility company representatives or book sellers, to gain access to a resident's home.

It was reported that the bus stop at the foot of Clack Lane was being used to park cars and this might cause issues with the bus stop and raid safety. The clerk was asked to report this to NYCC.

A number of maintenance issues had arisen over the summer and discussed and these included:

- water was flowing down the footpath along West End/Clack Lane at telegraph pole 36 between Westfields and Belle Vue Cottages. The clerk has reported this to Yorkshire Water.

- the Gents toilets are in need of some attention, particularly along the corridor.

- the village green seat replacement had been purchased . Other seats need power-washing, which will be carried out shortly.

- the defibrillator is intermittently causing an issue which the council have been attempting to sort out with the suppliers of the cabinet for some weeks. This had been reported officially to the First Responder in case of any issues arising from potential users and progress was being made to rectify the error.

Seven planning applications had been received between the two meetings and considered by the council with comments provided back to either Hambleton District Council or North York Moors as appropriate.

The external auditor has approved last year's final accounts and the clerk updated the council on the current financial position.

A number of other issues were raised under any other business and these included:

- a skip, situated on South End for at least 3 months, should be emptied and removed.

- a resident of South End reported issues with the cobbles.
- the footpath behind the football pitch was overgrown and in need of attention.

- Osmotherley School were looking into a number of its contracts, and the work done by the council to maintain the grass areas had been queried.

- the Playground lease with Yorkshire Water is still unfinished and it was agreed that this protracted issue be brought to a satisfactory conclusion asap.

- the Council Precept for 2018/19 should be discussed by the finance sub- committee.

The next meeting is to be held on the 19th October.

Rememberancetide, the period of the Poppy Appeal and Remembrance Sunday is nearly upon us again. This year the annual Poppy Appeal will commence on Saturday, 28th Oct. Local volunteer collectors will be conducting house to house collections in the village and surrounding area



and collecting boxes will be located in all our commercial outlets. Please support the Appeal and see if we can top the \pounds 5,000 mark this year!

On Sun 29th we will dedicate our Field of Remembrance at the village War Memorial at 11.45am and from then on you can place Remembrance Crosses in the field in remembrance of any ex-serviceman or woman who served their country and subsequently died. The crosses will be available from our collectors or collecting boxes in the village.

Remembrance Sunday falls on 12th Nov this year and will be marked by the usual Parade and Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial followed by a church service in St Peter's. There will be a temporary road closure and parking restrictions in place over the period of the parade, details of which will be announced in the next issue of the 'Messenger' and notices will be placed around the village.

The National 2 Minutes Silence will be held at the War Memorial on Saturday 11th November (Armistice Day) at 11.00am.

This year our theme will be 'The Promise of The Rainbow' and so you might like to look out some bright rainbow coloured clothes or accessories for the event!
