# Parish Council Meeting-19th October

The latest meeting of the Parish Council was attended by all councillors and by one member of the public and a representative of the local police force.

A number of issues which were raised at the last meeting, were discussed and confirmed as addressed, and these included:

- The layby on Clack Lane has been confirmed as a layby and not a bus stop
- The water leak on Clack Lane was confirmed as run off following a visit by Yorkshire Water
- Gents Toilet re decoration The Chairman has approached a contractor to quote for a repair to be done to the gents hallway to follow a specification drawn up by a member of the council
- The Chairman gave an update on the future of Thompsons Shop
- The clerk raised concerns with the School grass-cutting contract
- The footpath bordering the football field had been cut back

The Community Group had funded the village seat replacement on the village green and thanks were expressed by all.

The police attended the meeting and outlined the received written report in more detail and extended an invitation to host a day in the village to help residents 'etch' items such as cycles, garden tools, horse tackle etc. with personal details in the event of theft. Please let your local councillor know if this would be of interest.

The refurbishment of the cobbles in the village along South and North End is well underway it is hoped it will be to be completed shortly. This task is undertaken with the support of the National Park and whilst some residents will have been directly affected by the work, it is hoped that the resulting improvements will have been worth the inconvenience.

The Play Area received its annual inspection by an independent company and highlighted some areas for improvement regarding the quality of the equipment. The council agreed to look into this further and accepted that some items had reached their 'sell by date'!

The Remembrance Day ceremony would take place as usual, on the 12th November, with the usual road closures and diversionary routes along School Lane (parking restrictions will apply to residents so please read the notices carefully when they are erected).

Unseasonably, Christmas was raised and the issue of the Christmas tree and electricity to power the lights was once again discussed at length.

The defibrillator was now back in working order, with no small thanks to Bob Manners and on a lighter note it was confirmed that peacocks would soon be back in Thimbleby!



Congratulations to Professor Graham Hutchings, of Osmotherley. Professor Hutchings, who invented a greener way of producing one of the world's most common plastics has won a globally prestigious science award. He was recently invited to collect the Advanced Environmental Solutions Prize from the Italian Palace in the presence of Italian President Sergio Mattarella for his significant scientific breakthrough.

Described as the Nobel Prize of energy research, the award, from Italian company ENI is one of the top prizes for researchers in the field of energy and environmental science and has a prestigious list of recipients in its ten-year history. Professor Hutchings won the award for developing a substitute for the harmful and toxic mercury catalyst that is used in PVC's
