Parish Council Meeting -23rd Nov

The November meeting of the Parish Council was held one week later than usual and was attended by the majority of councillors. Issues discussed included the Remembrance Service and the council recognised the excellent work done by Col. David Black in helping to ensure the day went well.

Maintenance issued were as ever high on the agenda and it was reported that the repairs to the cobbled areas had been completed successfully, but that the bollard, previously knocked out and repaired had once again been hit. The public conveniences corridor to the gents will be repaired shortly. Once again the issue of refuse bins being left out was raised by concerned residents and this will be investigated.

The gullies on South End were reported as overflowing and the clerk was asked to report this to the Highways team. The play area refurbishment would be carried out in the Spring of next year, hopefully with the help and advice of interested parents in the village. Three planning applications had been received since our last meeting and these were all supported.

The clerk reported on the accounts for the year and it was noted that funds spent was likely to be greater than funds received for the year due to the cobbles repairs.

Cemetery fees were tabled and it was agreed to keep these at the same levels. Finally it was urged that as many residents attend the NHS Friarage consultation meeting in Northallerton on Thursday 14th December.

Hambleton Food Share welcomes contributions to its food sharing scheme which helps people in temporary financial difficulties, and who are struggling to feed themselves and their families. The Food Share scheme gives them an emergency parcel which will feed the family for 3 days (depending on the size of the family).

As Christmas approaches and we are all stocking up and preparing for the festivities, it would be good to think that our village is able to make a significant contribution to this excellent scheme.

There has been a box inside the door of St Peter's for quite a while now but it is rarely well filled. Please would you consider making regular donations, simply adding a little to your weekly shop. (Some people, of course, contribute to the Food Share at the supermarket.) With Christmas coming, a few extra treats would be welcome too to help make the day a little more special for people in need.
