Parish Council Meetings

Meetings of the council were held on the 14th December and the 18th January with many varied items discussed. The Christmas Tree was once again provided by Thimbleby Estate and thanks to them for their continued support.

Criminal activities reported to the police have been low over the two months however, following all the reports of disturbances caused by the football coaches in the village on the 30th December, not one report was made to the police. 6 supporter coaches arrived in the village causing traffic and social problems to a number of residents, particularly those in the public houses. The council will be asking the policing unit of Middlesbrough FC for comment as to why these coaches were allowed to leave the A19 and visit the village.

Rock salt has been bought for the village and after the most recent round of snow it is hoped that residents recognise the efforts made to keep roads and footpaths passable? Highways issues such as potholes and blocked gullies are continually reported and it is hoped that NYCC will continue to be responsive to these repair requests.

The North York Moors Authority have been in the process of updating their Park Plan, of which Osmotherley features prominently and meetings have been held with officers. The conservation area appraisal and questionnaire can be downloaded from

http://www.northvorkmoors.org.uk/planning/building-conservation and comments can be sent to building@northyorkmoors.org.uk Although the consultation is officially open until 9th February they have confirmed with the editors that they will be happy to accept comments for an additional week or two prior to amending the draft document.

There has been concern that mountain bike users are flouting the rules regarding riding them on footpaths and causing footpath damage and safety concerns for walkers. The concerns have been reported to the national park but understand this is a difficult problem to solve.

Yorkshire Water are intending to plant trees along the border of Cote Ghyll at Cod Beck Reservoir. It is hoped the community will get involved and tools, gloves, tea and biscuits will be provided. Osmotherley Village Theatre

Alan Ayckbourn's play brought to life by OVT. One night, three bedrooms and four couples make up Ayckbourn's Bedroom Farce. Originally written in the 1970s, the 2017 Osmotherley village hall audience did not appear to find the humour in any way dated. They quickly warmed to the ever increasing on stage chaos as the action moved from one bedroom to another.

The actors were greatly assisted by excellent staging - it is no mean feat to fit three bedrooms on to one small stage! Timely and creative use of lighting also enhanced the quickly changing bedroom scenes.

Hugely enjoyable as a comedy, the play also provides a perspective on marriage. Whether the older couple who presented a Thomas Hardy state of 'stale familiarity,' the newlyweds diverted by a husband's obsession with flat pack furniture, the wife frustrated by her husband's confinement to bed with a bad back, or the pair whose marriage was falling apart, each couple ably offered a convincing insight on marital relationships.

The challenge for any local theatre group is how to make characters credible to an audience principally composed of friends and neighbours. It is a testament to the quality of the acting, supported by skilful casting that these four couples were instantly transformed into the characters they portrayed.

The cast was made up of many familiar village faces; Angela Thomsett played Delia, Giles Pinkney played Ernest, Nick was played by Gary Greening, Jan played by Leah Wilson, Vanessa Robinson played Kate, Tris Sillars played Malcolm, Teresa Taylor played Susannah and Paul Howlett played Trevor. The play was directed by Barrie Robinson and lights and sound were the responsibility of Bob Manners. Another triumph for Osmotherley Village Theatre.
