Parish Council Meeting

Colonel Black attended to raise awareness of this years' 100th anniversary Remembrance Sunday on the 11th November 2018. A village Poppy Festival is being planned in the village over that weekend.

The council also continued the discussion on cyclists on rights of way footpaths and agreed to ask NYM to improve the frequency of challenging those transgressors!

The issue of yellow lining the corner of Back Lane and South End has been raised with Highways at NYCC but unfortunately at this time they are not inclined to support this. The council representative was asked to look into this further as it is an ongoing major issue for the village.

Cars were continuing to park on certain village cobbled areas and this should be discouraged where possible to avoid premature damage and more maintenance costs to the council.

The problems of the Ofsted report on Northallerton School was discussed and agreed that things should improve quickly once the school had been put in 'special measures'. Its move to Academy status now seems inevitable.

A green bin will be ordered to support the maintenance of the Pinfold by the volunteer who looks after it.

The electricity supply in Thimbleby is causing problems to its residents and it has been agreed that a grant claim will be made to NYM to support residents in improving the supply.

Data Protection rules are changing in May, putting more rules in place to parish councils and the clerk will attend a training session next month to assess what is required of the council going forward.

Two planning applications have been submitted and approved.
