Parish Council Meeting

Parish Council Meeting & AGM 17th May 2018.

The council had its AGM and meeting on the usual third Thursday of the month and the first order of business was to elect a new Chairman and Vice Chairman. The previous Chairman Mr T Swales had indicated that he would be stepping down and Mr M Stafford was unanimously elected to the office. Mr R Manners was also elected to the position of Vice Chairman, agreed by all present.

A resident attended to discuss a planning application in Thimbleby and this helped alleviate some concerns raised. The police also attended to discuss the monthly report which included four items of a 'suspicious nature'.

The Community Bus parking continues to be of concern to the entire village. The Chairman reported that further emails had been received and it was of the utmost importance to try and reach an amicable and practical solution which would be acceptable to the majority of residents and users of the service. However the site identified as a possible alternative parking area was deemed to be not a good prospect due to the extensive expenditure which would be required to carry out the necessary work to alter the area to cater for the bus.

The Clerk updated the council on the GDPR requirements and confirmed that the council was working towards compliance. The Post Office concerns were still being pursued with the Post Office customer services but progress was slow and an alternative contact was suggested. Parking issues on the corner of School Lane and West End were discussed and the council agreed to find a solution to this continuing problem. Another bollard was knocked down on North end and would be repaired soon with recompense being sought from the identified culprit.

Four planning applications had been considered either during the last month or at the meeting and all approved by the council, in it's advisory role.

Thanks were expressed to the owners of Cote Ghyll for the litter picking work undertaken in and around the caravan park and a representative of Hambleton would be invited to the next meeting to discuss recycling and litter-picking equipment available to village volunteers.

Next meeting is on the 21st June at 7pm.
