Parish Council Meeting 19th July

The meeting discussed the following:

The NY Moors NP reported that they were looking into the Queen Catherine pub alterations and associated issues.

The access path between the pub and the fish and chip shop was causing problems with access to the church, particularly for the disabled and Hambleton would be asked to comment.

The police report cited two instances of anti-social behaviour, one item of theft and two items of suspicious circumstances.

The new large bin at Cod Beck is under review after causing issues with overfilling.

The repairs to the public conveniences has been commissioned and the bus shelter would be inspected shortly to identify any concerns.

The clerk reported that the grant claim submitted to the Lottery for funding to improve the facilities at the Play Area has been successful, which will enable further funding to be applied for accordingly.

Some members of the PC had been instrumental in repairing damaged play equipment to enable continued use ahead of any replacement/refurbishment.

The date of the next meeting is on Thursday 13th September 2018.

Mike Cottingham and Colonel David Black

In 1928, 10 years after the end of World War One, the newly formed British Legion organised a pilgrimage to the battlefields and cemeteries in Flanders for the widows, children and other relatives of British war dead. The pilgrimage ended with a poignant ceremony to dedicate the opening of the newly built Menin Gate in the Belgian city of Ypres. The Gate bears the names of all British and Commonwealth servicemen who were killed in the Ypres Salient from 1914 to 1918 and have no known grave.

Ninety years on from that event and in commemoration of the 100 year anniversary of the ending of the war, the now Royal British Legion organised a new pilgrimage to the same area also ending with a ceremony at the Menin Gate. Since its formation, the membership of the Legion has vastly increased, and the Standards of hundreds of Branches were paraded in an impressive and moving ceremony on Wednesday 8th August.

Unfortunately, due to the physical demands of the long march to the Gate and the hour long ceremony which took place there, the Osmotherley Branch was unable to provide a Standard Bearer to carry its Standard. Thankfully a solution was found to

enable the Branch Standard to be there. Funding was provided by the Legion's County office and members of Goole and Howden Branch volunteered to act as Standard Bearer and to lay our commemoration wreath.
