Remembrancetide

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the end of World War 1. Nationwide commemorations are being planned and as publicised elsewhere in this issue of the Messenger, Osmotherley will be marking the occasion with a number of activities. Remembrancetide begins on Saturday 27th when the annual Poppy Appeal commences.

As usual, collecting boxes will be placed in all the village pubs, Top Shop etc. and volunteers will conduct a house to house collection. On Sunday 28th the Field of Remembrance at the War Memorial will be dedicated. Remembrance crosses will be available from collectors or commercial outlets. These can be placed in the Field of Remembrance at the service of dedication or afterwards.

Remembrance Sunday on this important anniversary appropriately falls on Armistice Day, 11th November and will be marked with the usual parade and Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial followed by a service in St Peter's. More details (including parking and road closure notices) in next month's issue.

A Community Harvest Festival will be held in St Peter's on Sunday Oct 7th at 10.45am.

Parish Council Meeting 13th Sept

The autumn session began on the 13th and the items discussed included:

- Issues concerning the Queen Catherine hotel have been raised by many residents over the summer and the passageway to the churchyard has also been causing problems. Both these issues are being addressed by the relevant parties.
- An inter agency meeting was held at the instigation of the PC, to discuss the resident concerns over the bus parking at Westfields. It was felt that real progress has been achieved and it is hoped that all parties can work together to improve communication in future.
- Five issues of anti social behaviour were reported to police between July and September together with 4 burglary reports. Grants for the play area improvements have been successful and as such the refurbishment of some of the existing equipment has been approved. It is hoped that this will take place before the end of November.
- The War Memorial planting is of concern following the Northgate team having to withdraw its support. A new supplier of services to the planting of the war memorial will be sought.
- Five planning applications were submitted for discussion during the last two months with all achieving approval, some with comments and concerns.
- The trees on North End, although in a conservation area, will be looked at once again with a view to pruning when appropriate to size and timing. An Arborist will be consulted initially.

Osmotherley and District Garden Club

Two meetings are planned for October, both in the village hall and visitors are very welcome to attend.

Tuesday 2nd Oct 7.30pm. From Plot To Pot with Martin and Jill Fish. This promises to be a varied evening which combines tips about growing fruit, herbs and vegetables with a culinary interest including tasting several recipes. The session will end with an horticultural Q&A. . Earlier this year Martin was awarded the Harlow Carr medal given by the RHS to those who have made an outstanding contribution to gardening in the North of England. Tuesday 30th Oct 2.00pm. Japanese Gardening with Andy Bolton. The illustrated talk will cover Hanami (Japanese blossom viewing) as well as the different types of Japanese gardens, their history, design, planting and what influences them. Our final meeting of the year will end with light refreshments.

Osmotherley and Area Oil Cooperative

Are you interested in joining us, to save money on heating oil?

The Cooperative now benefits over 100 households in Swainby, East Harlsey, Ingleby Arncliffe, Ingleby Cross as well as Osmotherley. By pooling our requirements we are able to negotiate a lower price for oil – previous orders have been 3-7p per litre lower than prices offered to individual customers.

How does it work?

Every other month the Cooperative Coordinator emails members asking for order amounts. The coordinator negotiates with various companies for prices based on the total volume and places the order. The oil is then delivered on agreed days, and the supplier sends each member a bill for their own oil. The bill is payable direct to the supplier from the member within two weeks. Members only order when oil is required – they don't have to order oil each time.
