Parish Council Meeting 18th July

The meeting began by reporting back on issues raised in previous meetings which covered the sale of the council's quad bike; the sourcing of the play area signage for the Village Green; the adoption of the Village Honours policy and proposed recipients, and that the ongoing maintenance of the defibrillator has been outsourced to Starting Hearts in Northallerton.

The police report was received detailing anti-social behaviour and suspicious circumstances. The council received reports on local authority matters which included Highways(sets on West End repaired). Hambleton Council asked for feedback on polling station resident accessibility and they confirmed the Hambleton Local Plan had been sent to the Secretary of State for approval.

The council discussed the options for improving car parking in the village in light of recent meetings with the owners of Thompson's Shop, with proposals submitted to NYCC Highways for comment.

The community of Thimbleby have expressed an interest in having a defibrillator housed in the phone box in the village. The council agreed to pursue the purchase of the phone box and confirmed that it would not be in a position to purchase or maintain the defibrillator going forward.

The council received the accounts for the month and supported the three planning applications received.
