

# Parish Council Meeting 17th October

Next month's Remembrance Service was raised by a resident who has been instrumental in its organisation for many years and confirmed that this would likely be the last time it would be celebrated in its current format. The council expressed its thanks for all his past work in commemorating this event each year.

Two unused BT phone boxes were discussed. The first in Thimbleby, which was adopted by the PC last month, would be used by the community there to house a defibrillator. The PC also agreed a one off contribution to help with the project. The second phone box is on Clack Lane and will be decommissioned early next year by BT. The PC agreed to adopt the phone box and asked residents in the area of Clack Lane for ideas for its use going forward. A streetlight is out on North End and the Clerk was asked to report this to HDC. Also along North End, footpaths have been marked for repair. The PC were not aware that repairs had been commissioned by NYCC and the Clerk was asked for confirmation, which was given and confirmed for starting on the 4th November for 15 days.

The amount of money we receive from the council rate payer via HDC was discussed for next year and a small increase was agreed. Parking issues were raised by a concerned resident, particularly near West End's junction with School Lane and it was agreed to raise this with those involved.

Work would commence on the corner of Back Lane and South End where land has become scruffy and future works to the bus shelter and the toilets would be discussed at the next meeting.

The Play Area has recently been inspected and one or two issues highlighted for repair. This was approved and work commissioned to bring the equipment back up to scratch. A sign will be erected on the village green highlighting the Play Area to residents and visitors alike.

We were overwhelmed at the success and we would like to say a big "Thank You" to everyone for your support - with donations of food and goods, or for giving up your time on the day - it raised over £450! - Hillside Sanctuary is a rescue home for over 3000 creatures, great and small. They have received £200. The letter from their founder, Wendy Valentine, says how grateful they are and that the donation will go directly towards the cost of drilling a borehole on newly acquired land for their horses, cows, sheep, pigs and goats.
- We have donated £120 to Save Yorkshire's Dogs. They do a great job of rescuing, veterinary checking and re-homing dogs in this area.
- Maxi's Mates near Guisborough received £100. The sanctuary opened seven years ago due to the sad plight of "Maxi" and rescues dogs with difficult temperaments as well as those hoping for their new 'forever' homes. We were moved to see that the big barn (they struggle to rent as housing) has some different features to other rescue kennels. Long term dogs have a very large pen each, furnished with comfy armchairs and carpet. Jane and Michelle have especially asked we pass their thanks to you all and also asked that if anyone has unwanted mats or an armchair that could make a needy dog feel they have a home of their own whilst in their care, please phone 075 071 04636.
