# 4. Matters arising:

# 4.1 Items not on the agenda

CN raised the issue of the 40mph limit be extended from Ellerbeck to the slip road onto the A19 south once again. The Clerk confirmed that the Highways Project Engineer had rejected the suggestion due to lack of road distance from the A19 and making the reduction obvious to road users.

#### 4.2 Police matters

A written report was provided by Stokesley Police in absentia.

#### 4.3 Highways

The Chairman reported that the footpath resurfacing along North End has been completed successfully however two new bollards, fitted during the project, were in need of 'tightening'. TW volunteered to look into the matter.

The Clerk was asked, once again, to report the flooding at Sheepwash.

MR reported leaks in the ditch near to the waterworks on South End. It was concluded that the excessive rain had caused many issues of flooding, including the manhole cover on the PlayArea. BM agreed to look into the matter.

## 4.4 NYCC, HDC & NYMNP

DH reported that some funds from hid Locality Budget would be used as a catalyst for NYCC to resurface the road between School Lane and Back Lane on South End.

DH also reported that the new NYMNP Local Plan was progressing well towards implementation.

#### 4.5 Maintenance

#### 4.6 Village Hall

NC reported that early in the new year a meeting would be held with the damp-proofing specialist Schrijver to ascertain the success or otherwise of the treatment in early 2019.

# 4.7 Capital Works 2020/21

The Chairman suggested that we consider looking into the refurbishment of the bus shelter and public conveniences. The Clerk confirmed that NYMNP funds under the Village Improvement Scheme would be available but limited to a maximum of £3000 per project.

#### 4.8 Queen Catherine

The Clerk reported that no response had been received from the owner of the QC following the delivery of the letter detailing our concerns last month. NC raised further concerns regarding the reinstatement of the village green area near the disabled parking area and the granite sets in particular. The Clerk was asked to look into a number of issues raised on the night and asked to liaise with NC and RH in bringing these back to the PC for further discussion.

The Clerk raised the request from a resident who wishes to promote the Lady Chapel more widely by erecting a sign in the centre of the village. The PC supported the idea but was concerned with the number of signs on the green in the centre of the village and possibly utilising the bus shelter might be a more suitable site. The Clerk was asked to liaise. A letter had been received from a resident of the village wishing to express their hope that the village would recognise the work done by Col.D Black over the years on behalf of the RBL. The PC agreed unanimously with the sentiment and agreed to write an article in the next Messenger.
