Covid 19 and Facemasks

As the country moves on from lockdown, a small group of sewers in Osmotherley have started to produce face masks in the belief that they have the following benefits:

1. They make it hard to touch your nose and mouth, thus providing protection for what is the biggest infection risk in most situations, namely hand-to-face transmission.

2. They reduce the exposure of your nose and mouth to viruses in the ambient air.

3. They reduce the chance that others will get infected from you when you are sick and don't know it. Extracted from Saving Your health, One Mask at a Time by Peter Tippett MD PhD.

Please note the use of the word 'reduce'; wearing a face mask is a protective measure and will not by itself prevent you from becoming infected so social distancing should still be observed. Their use is advised in public spaces and on public transport.

The masks have three layers of material, a filter and a drawstring cord that is adjustable, allowing the mask to sit comfortably over the mouth and nose. Across the bridge of the nose, wire has been fitted to facilitate a more secure fit. The filter can be removed, all parts are washable and they come with care instructions.

Masks are $\pounds 5$ each which will be donated to Herriot Hospice Homecare. Although we are hopping that there will be enough for all who'd like them, priority will be given to key workers, carers, those in vulnerable groups, people who need to visit doctors' surgeries/hospitals and who use public transport. If demand for masks is high, you may be offered one mask per person initially with a second to follow, unless you regularly need to be in more enclosed

public spaces. Please contact Fiona Manners on 01609 883020 to place an order.

Parish Council Meetings March, April and May 2020

The council met just before lockdown was commencing in March but we were not quorate (not enough councillors to meet officially), therefore the meeting was unfortunately cancelled.

The meeting in April was conducted using a video conferencing platform and enabled the business to be conducted. A discussion was held with the Highways Officer over what layout worked at the front of the Queen Catherine and it was agreed that resurfacing would take place as soon as practical. The police reported on three occurrences of anti-social behaviour. The Clerk had been contacted to report that signs had been erected closing off some footpaths around Boville Park which had not been approved by NYCC. They confirmed that the landowners had been contacted and that the sign would be removed. Six planning applications were considered and supported. The Clerk reported on the financial year end and new financial year accounts, which were approved.

The most recent meeting in May, also conducted remotely, considered reports from the police on the increasing anti-social behaviour reports; now up to eight from last month, mainly as a result of the parking issues on the road to Sheepwash. More gully work was required on South End to Bog Hole as flooding would become a bigger issue as time progressed. The Clerk would report to the authority responsible.

Damage to the tiles on the steps down to the ladies public toilets was reported and would be repaired. Plans to change the layout of the public toilets was presented for approval which was given, and work would commence to progress to planning approval. A resident requested a change to the road markings on North End which was discussed. It was agreed to carry out a site inspection and consultation. Ancient hedgerows had been removed from North End and these had been reported to NYM to determine if this was done correctly. Two planning applications were discussed, one approved and one not supported. Several complaints and concerns were raised by residents regarding the noise levels and hours of working at the Old Vicarage. The Clerk noted that this was under review by NYM. The year end accounts submission to the external auditor were presented and approved and the issue of verge cutting in wild flower growing time was raised and discussed. A speed restriction sign would be erected on the gate to the play area off West End as delivery vehicles seemed to be 'speeding'! Finally the war memorial had not been planted as yet due to virus concerns however it is hoped that this would happen in the next month.

A Big Thank You!!

On behalf of Thimbleby Community Action I want to thank all of the local residents and businesses that have donated so generously to the Telephone Box Defibrillator in Thimbleby. We have now raised sufficient funds for the first phase of the work to proceed. The telephone box now has its new livery and the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) has been purchased and is soon to be installed. Locally placed AEDs save precious treatment time and improve survival odds because they can be used before emergency medical service personnel arrive. When care is provided within five to seven minutes, including early treatment with an AED, survival rates improve dramatically. You are probably aware that an AED already exists in Os-

motherley, however this AED centred in Thimbleby will save precious time and serve the local residents and workers as well as the regular visitors such as walkers, cyclists, holidaymakers and shooting ground members. A "heartfelt" thank you.

Osmotherley and District Garden Club

10 tips on 'Watering your Garden' from Osmotherley and District Garden Club Always water well but infrequently as needed. Just damping the surface over a wide area is useless, target the vulnerable plants.

□ Prepare the plot for new plantings - find out how deep the dryness extends and water well over 1 to 2 evenings. Plant out the next evening and give a light watering to settle the plant into the ground.

 $\hfill\square$ If plants are root bound, tease out the roots to help formation of new ones to seek the moisture.

 $\hfill\square$ Do not water again until there are signs of stress, but once again give plenty of water.

□ For pots, start with damp compost and water lightly after planting.

□ Potted plants quickly dry out in the sun. For smaller pots, a good indication is the weight but for large ones try feeling down into the compost. Water well until a small amount flows from the drainage holes.

 \Box Avoid allowing pots to remain standing in water for more than a few hours as the compost will become airless and the plants will rot.

 \Box If compost has become completely dry, water will run straight through the pot. The usual remedy is to stand the pot in a container of water for a couple of hours so that the compost becomes moist again. Then allow to drain well.

□ Hanging baskets usually need water every day together with some soluble feed at least once a week when fully established.

Grass is very resistant to drought so unless it is essential to have bowling green sward, don't bother!

We hope you find our advice useful-for more helpful tips why not join the club? Membership fees (\pounds 2 per annum (\pounds 1 for over 60 and under 16)) go towards garden club initiatives that help to make the village look attractive – the recent display of bulbs along the verges on Clack to name but one.
