Sadly, the family and children's area and toilet facilities will be closed and it will not be possible to borrow books. To assist with cleaning and general hygiene, you will be requested to keep social distancing and to use hand sanitiser. There will be a designated seating area for private prayer and reflection. Welcomers will be on hand to assist you with arrangements and procedures

We are of course hopeful that as government and church restrictions are eased, we will be able to provide more opportunities for prayer and worship.

Parish Council Meeting-18th June

The council once again met remotely with full attendance and started proceedings by updating members on matters raised at previous meetings. The Clerk updated the situation regarding the 10 minute waiting sign near Topshop and hoped that this would be replaced very soon. The Queen Catherine front car park area has been resurfaced by the council and the opportunity has been taken to level the disabled path leading to the churchyard and include the area in front of the fish and chip shop. We can also confirm that the lighting on the front has been reduced both in number and wattage.

There was a request presented at our last meeting to support extending the yellow lines near to Back Lane on North End, which following discussions with the resident it was agreed to support. Reported concerns over contractor noise levels at the Old Vicarage have been addressed by the owner. Repairs have been made to the public toilet steps and signs on the gate leading to the Play Area have been erected to reduce speed limits for safety.

The police reported that there had been 8 cases of anti-social behaviour, 2 auto-crimes and 2 burglaries reported since our last meeting. The bus shelter had been inspected with a view to repairs and painting and planning authorities have been asked for advice regarding suggested amendments to the public toilets. A full application would be presented asap. There have been many issues raised in the village regarding the increased numbers visiting Sheepwash and the knock on problems the traffic causes in the village. There is a meeting group already set up to discuss the Sheepwash issues. This has been a long running group headed by the National Park, however, it was felt that a working party needed to tackle the issues in the village. Therefore it was agreed to set up a subgroup of councillors and other authorities, together with invited individuals to discuss ways in which the issues in the village can be tackled. This group would report its discussions back to the council.

Two planning applications were discussed extensively and support was not granted on either application. Finally, the Clerk raised the issue of opening the public toilets however it was agreed to wait for the July 4th potential relaxing of restrictions to determine this. The Play Area similarly would wait this decision.

You should also make sure you have working smoke alarms in your home. These are ways that lower the chance of a chimney fire in your home and reduce the risks of damage, injury or even death if one occurs.
