£2413.00 raised for Herriot Hospice Homecare!

During the darkest days of lockdown sewing machines around Osmotherley were started up to help address the shortage of medical scrubs and laundry bags for NHS staff. Knitting needles were also pressed into service to produce hearts for front-line carers, Super-Hero Medic dolls and blue poppies to remember NHS staff who died of Covid 19. Money to buy fabric for the scrubs was initially given by various individuals and added to by donations given in memory of a village resident who died of the virus.



The residue of this money formed the basis of a fund-raising collection to go to Herriot Hospice Homecare, a local charity whose caring work helps families across Hambleton and Richmondshire coping with terminal illness and bereavement.

The fund was added to by generous donations from cake and scone lovers around the village who supported the Tea and Coffee Shop Cream Tea afternoons in May. Since then the sewing machines have been very active again and the sale of over 250 face masks in and around the village has substantially increased the total raised. Grants were given from the Osmotherley Community Group to purchase the necessary materials for these.

There are so many people to thank; those who donated fabric and money for materials, cut out patterns, made and ate cakes and all who bought, and continue to wear, facemasks.

Particular thanks are due to the Osmotherley Sewing and Knitting Group, inspired by Jo Nunn and Eileen Webb, whose amazing stitching effort raised a fantastic £2413 for Herriot

Parish Council Meeting-16th July

The latest meeting of the council took place on July 16th 2020 remotely via Zoom.

The council received a report from the newly appointed sub group to look at car parking and traffic issues in the village. This sub group, made up from representatives of the council and interested residents will liaise with NYCC, NY Moors NP and other parties to look into ways of improving the issues highlighted recently after the removal of lockdown. The group also fed into the Hambleton DC survey currently being acted upon regarding Housing Needs and Car Parking in the village.

The play area and public conveniences were reopened on the 4th July. Additional cleaning and facilities have been installed in the toilets to improve the visitor experience. The Clerk has been given approval to apply for planning permission to alter the existing layout to a more modern unisex style facility.

Many residents will appreciate that the grass growth this summer has been extreme and this has had a knock on effect on our Caretaker's ability to keep on top of issues. Please bear with us and accept that certain areas may not be up to the high standard of previous years. The Clerk presented a report, drawn up following concerns expressed from the Burials Officer, regarding the space in the Cemetery. It was reported that a tree survey would be required to determine which trees within the confines of the land and which overhanging shrubs and trees on the edge of the property would require trimming. The concrete driveways to the right of the centre were proposed to be removed to allow for more space for future incumbents. The Clerk was asked to ensure the public were made aware of the proposals and to feed back any comments.

Two planning applications were considered and supported and another, previously objected to by a lot of residents and the council, has had its decision deferred by NYM until a site visit can be arranged.

The Council Rep raised the issue of a local government reorganisation in North Yorkshire. There is a government instruction that one tier councils should be implemented, however, there is likely to be disagreement between NYCC and Hambleton DC as to the best solution, as it is unlikely that both organisations will continue going forward.
