

Closure of Osmotherley Branch - The Royal British Legion

Sadly, the local Branch of The Royal British Legion has now closed after 83 years. The Branch was founded in 1937 and has managed to keep going longer than many but dwindling membership and advanced age has finally caught up with us and forced this decision on us. The final act was to lay up the Branch Standard in St Peter's Church which we did at a small and short ceremony on Sunday 13th December.

The Branch was active in the local community for many years having stalls at the annual Summer Games and at the Agricultural and Horticultural Show and for a long time we organised the Remembrance Sunday Parade and Act of Remembrance each November. Our activities and social events were all geared to raising money to fund the Legion's welfare work in the ex-service community and in particular, supporting the Lister House, the Legion's care home in Ripon. Over the past 20 years, we raised in excess of £160,000 through the annual Poppy Appeal and locally organised fund raisers of which our monthly bingo sessions in The Queen Catherine were a major contributor.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank villagers who have so generously supported us during our existence. Your donations and encouragement have made our efforts worthwhile and are very much appreciated. Thank you all so much.

For the future both Remembrance Sunday and the Poppy Appeal will continue in Osmotherley and the surrounding area. A new Poppy Appeal organiser, Major James Barry from Stokesley has kindly volunteered to take over collecting activities in the area and the Parish Council with help from St Peter's and those few remaining veterans in the village will ensure that Remembrance Sunday is still commemorated. Our thanks go to them.

Osmotherley Area Parish Council

Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meetings December 2020/January 2021

Many discussions of the council have been held in the knowledge that residents are having to stay safe in lockdown and more recently experiencing extreme weather conditions. Zoom meetings have been continuing since lockdown almost a year ago but as ever the work of the parish council continues.

Items discussed over the last two months include the road sets on West End, the work done in the Cemetery and Play Area, the gas bottle cages at the QC, bollards being knocked down on North End, gully clearing in the villages, salt bin refills, ice and snow and flooding issues, public conveniences quotations, village caretaker role, 2 planning applications and the continuing saga of increased visitor numbers to Sheepwash via the village and the issues of car parking.

The neighbourhood policing team/specials and response officers have been conducting regular foot and passing patrols in the Osmotherley and Cod Beck areas. Extra signage has also been organised with Highways to aim to prevent visitors from attending.

The pothole issues along Quarry Lane, together with fallen trees and flooding will be taken up with those responsible.

The council set up a working group in 2020 to liaise with Hambleton regarding village car parking and to discuss possible solutions to the ever increasing visitor numbers to Osmotherley, Cod Beck and Sheepwash. A report is nearing completion, however the actions necessary to alleviate the problems are numerous and incredibly expensive, and they are well beyond the means of the parish council. As a result, we are continuing to attract financial support from local and national government in order to provide a long term solution.

NEWS for Lent: Pause, Ponder, Pray

You are invited to take a walk around the perimeter of St Peter's any time during Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday February 17th.

Start by facing the porch and turn right. You will reach the first prayer post which is South. As you continue round the church, there will be a post marking the appropriate compass point. At each point pause, ponder, pray/reflect. There will be a short prayer on each post to aid your reflection but these are simply a guide and you must feel free to offer your own prayer or thought. You can take the walk alone or in a household group or bubble.

The Jar of Joy

When you have completed all four points of the compass, return to the porch. Next, take a leaf from the wire and record something that brings you joy or for which you want to give thanks. Post your leaf in the Jar of Joy. The leaves can be anonymous or you may wish to add your name. Please bring your own pencil or pen.


