Soup Collection and Delivery

During lockdown we organised a soup delivery service. Although we are not yet ready to re start our large scale soup events we will be starting a new soup delivery and collection service on **Wednesday 13th October**.

Please come to collect your soup with bread bun and/or fresh scone between 12 noon and 1.30pm. Donations welcome. If you are unable to collect your soup due to health reasons, please contact Eileen on 01609 883550 and we will arrange for delivery.

Many organisations and charities received little or no income over the past 18 months. After covering costs, all your donations will go towards supporting the continuing work of Osmotherley Community Group and St Peter's Church. As the strategy to support the developing situation in Afghanistan becomes clearer, we will also find ways to support refugees and those whose lives have been torn apart by recent events.

REMINDER: Village Harvest Festival: Friday October 1st at 6pm

He will pull a plough which we hope you will fill with tinned goods for Hambleton Foodshare. Following the service, there will be an opportunity to share food together in The Village Hall - look out for the traditional apple pies and hot dogs!

Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meeting 9 September 2021

The monthly meetings began again after our summer recess with an earlier than scheduled meeting due to the expected absence of the Chairman. The Clerk updated the council regarding the issues raised in July including highways issues at West Harlsey, planning problems at Winton and the future use of fireworks in the Summer Games. Yellow lines along North End have been discussed with the Highways Officer and it is hoped that these will be renewed soon. A memorial tree is to be planted in the Cemetery.

The planning authority has been contacted to advise both the council and the Village Hall committee on potential for replacing windows and doors in the Village Hall. Work continues in finding solutions to sourcing a contractor to undertake work to refurbish the public toilets and meetings with a specialist is scheduled for later this month.

The Clerk presented a report asking that the council move to internet banking, which was agreed unanimously. Arrangements for this years Remembrance Service are in hand.

Concerns have been expressed over the continual placement of the blue bins outside the Three Tuns and the council has been in consultation with residents, waste collection, NYCC and the previous owner to attempt to find a solution. Unfortunately this has not been forthcoming and it was decided to officially communicate with the new owners to highlight the council's concerns. Residents have also been concerned over the potential use by the new owners of the parking bays in front of the Three Tuns and the council was asked to write to confirm our position that these should remain as parking bays going forward. 9 planning applications have been submitted and considered since our last meeting with 7 being fully supported and 2 having 'no objection' to the plans.

The accounts were considered and agreed for the period. Under 'any other business', the Caretaker was asked to ensure excess grass be removed from verges and that the verge be cut on the east side of North End up to opposite Rueberry Lane. Next meeting: Thursday 7th October.

Remembrance Sunday will be marked by the usual Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial at 11am on Sunday 14th November. There will be no march past as some of our few remaining veterans would find this a little difficult to do. All other features of the Act of Remembrance will remain the same. We hope as many veterans as possible will be able to join us at the War Memorial for this commemoration. A box of large poppies will be delivered to the school so the pupils will be able to make commemorative posies to lay on the War Memorial and we would like to see this tradition continue in future years.
