# Osmotherley Area Parish Council-June 

Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meeting 16th June 2022
The meeting commenced with the Clerk outlining the list of actions from the previous meeting. These included:

The footbridge at Bog Hole has still not been replaced due to problems with the supplier. NYCC hope it will be September.

The hole in the road on North End has been inspected. The parish council has to investigate the blocked culvert in the verge before the repair can be completed Quotations are being obtained. The culvert causing issues on Clack Lane for Orchard House has been chased for a solution.
Gullies along North End have been inspected by NYCC and determined that they can wait until the annual maintenance programme.
Members were unhappy at the situation and the NYCC ward member agreed to take up the concerns. A resident reported concerns at the last meeting around second homes and the lack of affordable homes in the village. A reply has been received from NYMNP and they have raised similar concerns. It was noted that a poll held by the parish council in Whitby had confirmed its own issues with second homes. It was agreed to wait and see how things progress in Whitby before continuing with further action.

Broadacres have responded to our concerns over the grass-cutting in Oswaldene and this has been due to contractor issues, which they assure us has now been corrected.

Concerns were raised regarding speeding vehicles through the villages of Thimbleby and Ellerbeck and the Clerk reported these to the speed survey team at NYCC. It was agreed that a speed survey be carried out initially in Thimbleby.

Residents on North End have commented on the need to look at having the trees pruned and the Clerk will look into obtaining the necessary quotations and permissions to undertake the work.

One planning application was received and the council had no objections to the work. The village CCTV coverage was discussed and it was agreed to review its effectiveness and coverage.
Finally, the parish council would like to thank everyone involved in making the Jubilee weekend a great success for the village.

## Swifts and Swallows

Those who have lived in Osmotherley for a number of years will probably be aware of the huge reduction in the numbers of swifts, swallows and house martins in our skies this year.
Osmotherley used to be well known for its swifts and to hear them screaming overhead was a sign of Summer.
There may be several reasons for their decline but one of them is almost certainly a reduction in insects on which they depend. We can all do our bit to help by leaving wild Places, not cutting down long grasses and wild flowers which provide a habitat for insects and not using pesticides in our gardens. Tidying every patch of grass means depriving insects of anywhere to live, feed and breed and thus deprives birds, amphibians and hedgehogs of food and shelter. Churchyards can be a wonderful wildlife haven if managed for wildlife. Many people may think leaving banks and verges uncut looks untidy but seeing buttercups, cow parsley, red campion and ox-eye daisies is far better than seeing dying grasses and would make a huge difference to the biodiversity of our village and beyond.
Please think before you mow ! Less mowing means less fuel, less cost, less carbon dioxide and less global warming.
