Question: What task has taken place in the village every week for the past 129 years? (answer on page 4)

And this could be vou!

People are often surprised to find that the clock is still wound by hand, unlike many that have been converted to electric drive. It's a magnificent piece of Victorian engineering the size of a large chest freezer; and is driven by three dustbin size cast iron weights that have to be wound up the tower each week. This is now undertaken by a rota of twelve clock winders, "The Worshipful Company of Osmotherley Clockwinders", who humbly dedicate themselves to the task.

We keep a waiting list of people who have expressed an interest in joining us and we now have some vacancies on the list and welcome applications. It must be said that the road to becoming a full Winder is long and arduous and that not all who start will necessarily finish the journey. However, full training is given before a Winder first undertakes a lone wind, including detailed Operating Instructions, Risk Assessment, and the Canons [the Clockwinders' Code of Conduct]. But we're pleased to say that noone has ever failed to make the grade. Traditionally a male organization, we are now open to all genders, LGBT, and non-binary applicants. We were recently delighted to welcome our first lady Winder. Winding is not without its perils, and we celebrate our work at the annual Clockwinders' feast, surely thee hottest ticket on the Osmotherley social scene!

Osmotherley Area Parish Council-July

The councils last meeting before its August 'holiday' and the issues discussed included: The bog hole footbridge - work would begin early August (update, indeed work has begun).

The hole in the road on North End and verge has been repaired.

Concerns over blocked drains was discussed and the Clerk asked to write to the Director of Highways at NYCC.

Second homes and holiday home concerns were discussed following the Whitby vote and a national questionnaire would be completed, researching concerns of communities and regions.

A weeks speed survey has been completed in Thimbleby following concerns that many were exceeding the 30mph limit (update, results compiled show that only 5% broke the limit and none over 45mph).

A tree survey has been carried out and the application has been submitted to NYM to enable work in the autumn to trim them to limit encroachment on nearby properties. Approval awaited.

The Ukrainian flag, to show support for the country and approved by the church, has now been erected. Thanks to all those involved.

Highway issues included pothole repairs in School Lane, set damage on the edging of the green and bollard damage on North End.

The Police report included concerns over anti social behaviour at Cod Beck, which with the current fire risk concerns is taken very seriously by the police.

The public conveniences have had two issues, a water leak meant that the stop cock had to be located, which was more difficult than first thought. Drains then became blocked and the toilets closed for a couple of days. Thanks to Yorkshire Water for assistance in rectifying both problems.

Concerned residents raised issues over the firework display and the sign at Moon House. Both these discussed and reported to the correct authorities.

Two planning applications were received were discussed and supported.

The school would soon be undertaking a consultation exercise to combine the preschool and primary school into one organisation.
