#### What is a Parish Council?

A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish and has an overall responsibility for the well-being of its local community. It is the level of government closest to the community, with the district authority above it in the hierarchy (as of 1st April 2023 this will be North Yorkshire Council (NYC), replacing Hambleton District Council (HDC) and North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) with a single unitary authority). As it is the authority closest to the people, parish councils are invariably the first place people will go with concerns or ideas. For this reason they are a vital part of any community.

#### What decisions do Parish Councils make?

Parish councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), helping local groups, managing green spaces and campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities.

It's true to say that on their own, parish councils have limited powers to make decisions. But they do have the opportunity to negotiate with, and have the ability to influence, those other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the district or unitary council, national park, police etc).

In this respect parish councils are influencers. The organisations that make the final decisions know that a parish council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something, and its views will be taken seriously.

#### What powers do Parish Councils have? What can we do?

They have a wide range of responsibilities which essentially relate to local matters, such as looking after community buildings, village greens, play areas, graveyards and cemeteries, public conveniences, bus shelters, and much more. The council also has the power to raise money through taxation, the precept. The precept is the parish council's share of the council tax. The precept demand goes to the billing authority, currently the district council, which collects the tax for the parish council. The majority of our annual budget goes towards village maintenance including grass-cutting and the provision of public conveniences in the village. Our accounts are audited in line with all local authorities in the UK.

#### What don't we do?

We don't look after roads, footpaths and other highways issues such as gully emptying. We do however report concerns to North Yorkshire Highways to rectify issues, such as pothole repairs. Lighting, flooding and drainage issues are also not our area of responsibility but any report to the Clerk will be passed onto the relevant authority.

We don't look after public footpaths, green lanes or bridleways. These are maintained by landowners and the relevant authority either North York Moors National Park (NYMNP) or NYCC, Countryside Services. We are not responsible for overgrown hedges, broken stiles or gates on footpaths or indeed rubbish left in hedgerows. However, if you see things you feel need reporting then contact the Clerk.

If you see poor or inconsiderate behaviour such as public nuisance or bad or irresponsible parking, then contact the police on 101. We also do not get involved with neighbourhood disputes!

As mentioned earlier we are a consultee for planning matters. The planning authority, in Osmotherley's case NYMNP, has responsibility to consult, but also the decision to grant or decline an application rests with them, not us. HDC is currently the other planning authority in our area who also have a duty to consult. These powers will pass to NYC in April 2023.

#### Our Council

Our councillors are all volunteers, giving their time to represent the village and wider community. We contract a Village Caretaker to help maintain the green areas in the village that we are responsible for and a Burials Clerk to look after the Cemetery. The Clerk is the only paid employee.

#### Osmotherley Area Parish Council

Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meetings December & January. Various culverts continue to cause problems to the village and both Yorkshire Water and NYCC have attended to repair damage over the last few months, this work has now been completed. The footpath to Bog Hole from the Osmotherley side will need our intervention in the Spring as NYCC will not join the footpath to the road in a hard surface. Tree works have been completed and a review in Spring will take place on the remainder of the trees on North End. Inconsiderate parking continues to plague the village, with concerns being raised by residents of School Lane and Back Lane. Should residents encounter this they are to contact the Police. Unfortunately, as much as the Parish Council have tried to persuade NYCC to install more yellow lines, as we have done for many years, they have again refused to act, in part because they do not acknowledge that there is a problem.

Concerned residents of Clack Lane Bottom have, independently, asked for a speed survey to be undertaken with a view to reducing the speed limit from 60mph to 40mph after exiting the A19 towards Northallerton and from Ellerbeck in the other direction. The PC agree that this would be beneficial to reduce the dangers of potential accidents at this key point of entry into Osmotherley. Five planning applications were considered and supported by the PC in this period. Thanks were expressed to Mr B Manners and Mr T and A Forsyth for the erection, decoration and disposal of the christmas tree.

Finally, the Chairman provided an update on privately owned land for a potential car park within the village. More details and information on this will be provided in the coming months.
