INSECTS SOS (Insect Crisis -part1)

What is your reaction to the word Insects? Nasties! flies, midges, wasps, beetles, mosquitoes and locusts. Think again - now imagine a world without insects;

No pollinators - most plants, fruit and vegetables will vanish

Natural food chain collapsed - birds and insectivorous animals starved to extinction

Human food supply disintegrated (half of our food depends on pollinated plants) and a shortage of animal feedstocks

Roughly 80% of the world's population regularly eat insects!

No natural disposal of waste, corpses and dung, no breakdown of timber or leaves for recycling of nutrition

Within a few years, most mammals, fish, birds and amphibians will vanish: humans will suffer malnutrition and starvation.

Within a few decades most of life will be gone and the world will return to a state of a billion years ago.

In the words of Sir David Attenborough

"If we and the rest of the back-boned animals were to disappear overnight, the rest of the world would get on pretty well. But if the invertebrates were to disappear, the world's ecosystems would collapse"

You have probably already noticed that the decline of many insects such as wild bees and ladybirds, has already started. Flying insects have declined by an average of 60% in the past 20 years and 80% of butterflies are in decline. Bird and bat populations are falling, hit by the reduction in insects for food and loss of habitat. What is causing the demise of insects?

MAN

Global Warming - climate breakdown with weather extremes bringing iwarmer, wetter weather leading to flooding, droughts, storms and changes to land use, water resources and pollution.

Loss of habitats, through agricultural practice (intensive use of land), destruction of rain forests, loss of wild areas, hedgerows, flower meadows and water sources.

Treating insects as enemies through increased acreage of land treated with pesticides and herbicides (massive increase in use of glyphosates)

Light pollution – light in urban areas is growing at 6% pa, but more than 60% of invertebrates are nocturnal. Light interferes with insects' biological clock of hibernation, mating and egg laying

It is not all gloom. Insect Crisis (Part2) to come, will show it is not too late to do something. Meanwhile, look after the wasps. They do a lot more good than harm.
