Remembrance Sunday 12 November 2023

This year, Remembrance Sunday falls on 12th November. On Saturday 11th we will observe the National 2 Minutes Silence at the War Memorial and would welcome anyone who wishes to join us for that commemoration.

On Sunday 12th, there will be the usual road closure of the village centre to allow the Act of Remembrance to take place. Diversions will be in place to allow through traffic via School Lane and Back Lane. As the police will not be in attendance the Parish Council have engaged a company to undertake the task of traffic control but require the assistance of two more volunteers. Anyone willing to help is asked to contact the Parish Council as soon as possible. We also ask those villagers who normally park their cars close to the war memorial to remove their from 10.45 to 11.15am on the day.

Veterans wishing to take part in the ceremony are asked to be at the war memorial at 10.45am. The village band will support the event as usual and school children will lay posies of poppies at the memorial after remembrance wreaths have been laid. After the Act of Remembrance there will be a Service in St Peter's Church.

Osmotherley Area Parish Council October 23

The meeting was attended by Cllr David Hugill, newly elected as representative of North Yorkshire Council (NYC) and two residents of the village. The members were updated regarding issues arising from the last meeting: the damaged 20mph sign on West End which is scheduled for replacement this week; the work on the path at Bog Hole has been completed; the overgrown shrubbery on South End has been cut back; the hazardous materials stored at Scholla Grange is with the Environment Agency and is the subject of an ongoing criminal investigation; the completed inspection of the Play Area by RoSPA, which was very positive, given the age of the equipment; a damaged manhole cover near 12/14 South End repaired on 11th October 2023.

Members were taken through the latest findings of the working party responsible for investigating the ownership and responsibility of land in the village not currently deemed to be Highways or Village Green. The presentation included plans that highlighted areas in the village that are not currently maintained using public funds. Village residents have raised concerns about these areas. They include various parts of the village, including the land outside the Queen Catherine, round the corner from the village hall and toilets, as well as the land behind the bus shelter, amongst others.

The working party have now had sight of land that is clearly delineated as Highway or Village Green by NYC and have been informed that the areas not highlighted as Highways or Village Green do not come under NYC control or jurisdiction. Most members felt that this topic had been extensively discussed over the years, and thanks to the exhaustive investigation undertaken by the working party now is the appropriate time for the Parish Council (PC) to conclude its effort and focus on this matter. It was therefore agreed that the PC, having considered next steps, have no viable avenues left open to them other than to allow Cllr Hugill to take this challenge on to higher levels within NYC on our behalf, with due consultation taking place if necessary. It's crucial to clarify to all residents that the issues identified by the PC during its numerous investigations could potentially have a negative impact on the village if public funds were to be used for future maintenance of areas not currently falling under their control. For instance, this could include the loss of parking spaces in front of, or near properties that have historically enjoyed such parking and deem that to be associated with their dwelling. Furthermore, it was unanimously agreed that no further discussions would take place in future meetings until progress is made by the NYC regarding this matter.

The police report reported one anti social behaviour issue, namely eggs being thrown from a car. It seems that this is an ongoing issue for the police in the area. North Yorkshire Moors held a planning meeting for parish councils outlining priorities for the future including an emphasis on affordable housing to help offset the increased numbers of young people leaving the area. It was also reported that planning application fees will rise by around 25% from April 2024.

Remembrance Sunday - two volunteers needed to help with traffic management for an hour on the 12th November. Any volunteers please contact David Black.
