Osmotherley Parish Council - Dec/Jan

In December a proposal to 'wild' an area of village green central to the village was not supported by council. A replacement for the tree blown down in 2022 was discussed and agreed that the original site was unsuitable due to the culvert running down the length of the village green on North End. A revised alternate site for the replacement tree is being sought.

A planning application from Westlands Farm for the formation of a new glamping site was discussed and whilst councillors felt they couldn't support the application on the grounds of the unsuitable access road it agreed to have no objections to it going forward to the planning authority for a decision. The council have raised concerns with Highways regarding the water flowing down West End and Clack, which unfortunately comes from private land bordering the road in question.

The village public toilet refurbishment has been revised and further quotations sought for work to commence, hopefully, by the end of March 2024. A resident asked if the trees on North End could be trimmed further. The National Park would have to be consulted.

Two further planning applications were supported and it was reported that NYC had agreed to the Haynes Arms for the siting of static caravans and camping pods in an application we objected to back in 2020, having satisfied the planning authority of its many concerns.

It was agreed to raise the Parish Precept by 4% next year.

In January the meeting had no planning applications to discuss and the Clerk updated the council on the many highways issues, in particular the blocked culvert issues causing water to flow from Cuddy Lane and near the entrance to Westfields. A meeting with the Highways Officer responsible for our area would be held shortly to discuss further. The Clerk requested residents to inform him of potholes in the village, should they be at least 2 inches deep, with photos and location. Likewise other highway issues should be reported and would then be passed onto Highways at NYC for consideration. The bollard, knocked down on North End, has been reported and due to be replaced soon. The NY Council representative updated the PC on the financial position of the unitary confirming that savings to help balance a very beleaguered budget had been identified. He also confirmed that Stone Cross, Hambleton DC's old offices, would be sold.

Interview with Gill Hunton

Gill recently spoke with Heather Rowe to give a potted history of her time at pre-school. **How did it all start?**

In the Summer of 1989, I took my daughter, Becca, to the playgroup in Osmotherley village hall. We had a rota for parents to run it, so I signed up. However something needed to happen~ we had more than 20 children aged 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 years and by 2002, we realised we had outgrown the village hall. The building next to the school was almost derelict and had been offered to the residents of Osmotherley for educational purposes. Thanks to Michelle Wood and Jackie Faber, £80,000 was raised through events, donations and grants and a year of preparing the premises for habitation, Osmotherley Preschool was born. It first opened for three mornings a week and had four activity rooms and four members of staff. Sue Hutchinson and I, who were also working as Teaching Assistants in school, led the pre school~ Sue had the qualifications and was musical; I had a finance background and loved the outdoors~ a perfect combination! I studied to gain a BA (hons) degree in Young Children's Learning and Development and when Sue H left, I became the Manager and the rest is history!

What have been your funniest moments?

Exploring paint Jackson Pollock style by squirting paint onto wall paper on the playground and riding bikes through it. I had to demonstrate and obviously the small tricycles weren't designed for adults~ I tipped backwards into the paint, to the great amusement of staff and children.

Another 'painty' moment occurred when I had to persuade one child to have his feet painted so he could make a footprint picture. I painted mine to show him it was ok and he proceeded to continue the painting, not on his own feet but right up my legs.

What have been your favourite things about Pre-school

Time of year with the children? It's Autumn~ so many brilliant forest school opportunities. Christmas is lovely too, but exhausting!

Nursery Rhyme? It has to be Jack and Jill.

Book? I always loved the Percy the Park Keeper and Animals of Farthing Wood series. More recently the Stick Man and Gruffalo books have joined my list. Anything to do with nature!

What have been your proudest moments?

Sitting opposite the Ofsted inspector when we gained our outstanding grade.

Becoming Early Years Educator Nursery Manager of the Year Being runner up in the Outstanding Individual Practitioner Award (which included a lovely trip to London!)

I love my job~ it's physically and emotionally demanding, but so rewarding when all the hard work to meet the needs of each unique little individual means they move successfully onto the next stage of their education.

What plans have you got when you retire?

I've got 4 grandchildren aged 2-11 so will be kept busy.

I'm going to catch up with gardening and decorating~ I'm sure there will be lots more too!

Local Archaeological Lecture


