

# Osmotherley Parish Council - Feb 2024

### Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meeting 15th February 2024

The PC meeting was attended by a resident concerned about the traffic issues on South End corner where yellow lines have not been replaced following resurfacing works. The issue has been reported to Highways by the resident and is to be followed up by the PC. The Clerk updated the PC on the issues of the running water from Cuddy Lane. A meeting took place between the Clerk, Highways and NYM to identify the issues and areas of responsibility. Landowners were identified and are to be contacted. The other surface water issue from the field near Westfields with water flowing down Clack Lane, is to be attended to by the landowners in the near future, according to recent information received. The council has a responsibility to ensure the trees owned by the PC are regularly inspected by an arborist for insurance and safety purposes. Following this an inspection from a NYM representative will then determine the scope of any work required.

The site for the replacement tree, blown down in 2022, will also be determined.

Work has been ongoing to bring the toilet refurbishment to a point where a contract can be agreed. It is hoped that this will be possible by the end of March 2024.

Councillors raised further highway concerns regarding road surfaces in Thimbleby and Kirby Sigston, which the Clerk is to report.

The PC considered three planning applications and supported each.

The defibrillator needs new pads and paediatric pads are also to be ordered.

The paint spill outside the Three Tuns/Moon House was noted and it is hoped that this will be cleaned shortly.

The next meeting of the PC will be the 21st March 2024.

### Nature Notes in Osmotherley

Having had one of the wettest and certainly warmest Februarys ever, plants are beginning to show a bit earlier than usual and villagers might like to know what to look out for in the weeks ahead.

On the uncut verges, there are early signs of Goose Grass or Cleavers, White Dead Nettle (which does not sting!), Herb Robert, and young Dock leaves. The Lesser Celandines are beginning to flower and under the hedges there are quite a few drifts of snowdrops, which seem to have enjoyed this very wet Winter.

Ivy flowers are now turning into black 'berries' and the Hazel bushes are full of catkins (Lambs' Tails) waving in the wind. A few Daisies are opening up too – a sure sign that Spring is on the way.

Dog's Mercury, found in hedge bottoms and woodland, is one of the earliest plants to arrive. Much more attractive is the little Moschatel which often grows on banks of streams or edges of damp woodland. It has wonderful acid-green flowers and foliage and grows close to the ground. Look out for it near the bottom of the valley steps and in the woods

As the days lengthen, everything rapidly starts to show and there will soon be many more wild flowers to look out for. If the verges outside your house are left uncut until late summer, you will be surprised at how many wild plants we have – all of which have a part to play in encouraging insects and birds. A 'weed' in your garden is only a plant in the wrong place and we all need to learn to love dandelions which are a wonderful early source of nectar for bees, have edible leaves for salads and exquisite seed heads. *Angela*
