Osmotherley Area Messenge

The Osmotherley Environment Group wants to encourage people to tread more lightly on our Earth by thinking globally and acting locally. And the Group's Sustainability team is hoping to set up an **Osmotherley Repair Café**. Repair Cafés reduce waste by extending the life of everyday items, save people the cost of replacing repairable items, help people practically by showing them how to repair their own items and provide an opportunity to learn where you can see and discuss all the repairing going on around you.

The Repair Café will be a hands-on space where people get to practise and understand how things work and how to repair them. When items can't be repaired at the Repair Café, then we may be able to offer appropriate alternative advice.

We're looking for local residents with different skills who can be present as repair experts during the Repair Café sessions. We are looking especially for people who are handy with fixing, mending, repairing and sharpening: clothing and textiles, toys, bicycles, computers and phones, electrical appliances, ceramics, glass, antiques, furniture and wooden objects, clocks and hand tools. We could also use people who are knowledgeable about computers and the Internet. You don't have to be professionally qualified, you will only work within your competence. And you will be supported by the other repairers both with repairing, to be safe and to learn about other aspects of repairing.

We also need people to act as front of house and help administer the Repair Café. You would welcome visitors and serve as a contact point for both visitors and repairers alike, making sure that everything runs smoothly and help providing tea and coffee. Depending on the number of repairers we can recruit and the demand from "customers", we would hope to run a Café every two months. Osmotherley Parish Council - March 2024

The Parish Council met and was updated on the following items.

The village trees have been given approval for a 'light touch' prune, which will be actioned when appropriate. The replacement tree, for the one that collapsed on North End, has also been agreed and will be planted soon.

The path damage issues at the end of Cuddy Lane will, hopefully, be repaired by NYC very soon. The accidental paint spillage in front of the Three Tuns has been cleaned up by the owner and the PC express their thanks.

The council tax accounts have been received and the true extent of the cost of levelling up the prior years' amounts to each district revealed.

The notification of the plans to turn prior waste land into common land at Osmotherley Moor was received.

The NYC representative notified the PC of the reply from the North Yorkshire County Solicitor regarding the highway waste issues which reiterated our understanding of the issue, in that what NYC consider to be highway maintained at the public expense has not changed and any future challenge will be considered by the appropriate means. The PC's position on this subject has also not changed.

Finally Mr Bob Manners has resigned his position as councillor, due to him leaving the village, and the PC expressed their grateful thanks for all his hard work over the past 7 years.

Nature Notes: Spring Flowers

It was the official first day of Spring on 21st March and on a short walk through the village and down the valley steps, on a sunny Sunday afternoon, I found many wild flowers in bloom or promising to be in flower very soon. Primroses in the bank near 'Paul's Steps' and all the way down on both sides, a carpet of lime green Moschatel. Where the ground is boggy, the leaves of Marsh Marigold and among the trees a large area of Wild Garlic. This makes excellent pesto or there are plenty of young Nettles to make soup (leeks, potato and nettles cooked in stock, seasoned and whizzed to a puree make a nourishing and tasty soup). Or there are young dandelion leaves to add to a salad. Other flowers in bloom were Forget-me-not, Evergreen Alkanet with its little bright blue flowers, Lesser Celandine, Dandelion, delicate white Wood Anemones and creeping in the grass, the tiny white flowers of the barren Strawberry. Coltsfoot flowers are a bit like a yellow daisy and come out before the leaves appear.
