Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meeting-AGM Tuesday 13th May

The rearranged date commenced with the election of Chairman and Vice Chairman for the following year. Both existing officials (volunteers) were re-elected for the forthcoming year.

The Clerk updated the council on outstanding issues which included a meeting with the landowner of the field purchased for a possible car park, which is unlikely to be developed at this time. It is hoped however that Thompsons shop will be developed for the benefit of the village and the Council have committed to support the ongoing exploration of how this might be achieved. The damaged bollard on North End has been replaced and the loose kerb in front of Top Shop also repaired. The consultation exercise regarding the future of the BT phone box concludes in June and our support for its continuation has been lodged with the necessary authorities. The VE Day Celebrations in the village were well supported and the PC thanked all those involved with the organisation of the event which saw all aspects of the Community come together in great support. The PC had received enquiries regarding the spraying of weeds along the wall along School Lane, which raised issues over the way in which the village is kept well presented moving forward. It also considered a request to trim the trees in the village, particularly along North End. A full survey and approvals to trim the trees would be looked into in the autumn.

Three planning approval were considered and approved.

The final accounts were signed off by the Chairman for submission to the government appointed external auditor.

NATURE NOTES: End of May

It has been one of the driest Springs on record and although many people have enjoyed the sunshine, despite a cold wind, it has been a difficult time for the natural world. The lack of rain has kept the slugs at bay and the worms deeper underground, meaning less food for hedgehogs, amphibians and birds like blackbird and robin. Wild flowers have struggled to survive where the soil has dried out, making it even more important to leave areas uncut. Grass that has been mown very short leaves no refuge for insects. Brown grass is a lot less attractive than green areas both to wildlife and to us. Those of you who have left areas uncut for No Mow May may be happy to continue to leave a small area uncut.

What can we do to help? Probably the most important thing is to put out shallow dishes of water to drink and deeper water (with a stone to help animals get in and out) for bathing. Gardens are an important area for wildlife and aside from leaving a few areas 'messy', not using insecticide sprays and weedkillers would be of huge benefit. Birds and insects are having a tough time as it is without their food sources being destroyed.

Yorkshire Wildlife Trust has an excellent website - **ywt.org.uk** - with a link to their Wildlife Gardening Hub which offers all sorts of useful information on how to make gardens more wildlife friendly.


