Osmotherley Area Parish Council Meeting - July 17th 2025

The meeting was held in Kirby Sigston Village Hall as our last meeting in the summer cycle. The major highways news was that agreement had been sought, following issues reported in the village after heavy rainfall, for Highways to clear the gullies in the village over a few days in early August. This is very much done as a one-off event and the council would like to express their thanks to NYC for undertaking this vital maintenance work ahead of the cyclical gully maintenance due in February.

The NYC representative gave an update on the internet situation in Thimbleby and a representative of the company responsible for undertaking the works, Quickline, is to be invited to the next meeting in September.

Two benches have been repaired in the village, tree works approval applied for from NYMoors NP and support provided to a resident who feels that the war memorial is in need of some attention to make it more presentable.

The disabled access to the church was raised as a clear passage was not always available and the Clerk asked to raise with the owner of the QC.

The concerns surrounding Osmotherley Pre-School and the recent public meeting were discussed at length, with the full support of the council confirmed. During the meeting, we explored various ways in which that support could be demonstrated and how we might reassure the Pre-School Trustees that our commitment will be sustained. Following the meeting, the Chair wrote to the Trustees to reaffirm the council's support and outline the key areas discussed. He was also able to confirm a grant of £4,000 from the NY Councillors Locality Fund to support the Pre-School.

NYC have taken over the running of the Sheepwash Action Group (SWAG) raising an official response to anti-social behaviour at Cod Beck and Sheepwash. A number of events and posters will be available throughout August.

The steps in the village leading to the Catholic church, across the village green will be repaired following a resident fall.

A plea to residents to trim overhanging trees and bushes that can cause obstruction was also raised.

The next meeting of the PC is due in the Village Hall on the 18th September 2025.

Osmotherely Pre-school

Update from Pre-School Meeting 16 July 2025

The Pre-School Committee would like to thank everyone who attended the meeting in July. There was a brilliant turnout of almost 30 people including those from across the community, the Parish Council and Councillors from The North Yorkshire Council. The conversation was enthusiastic and there is clear passion for supporting the long-term viability of pre-school and the importance of protecting education within the village as well as the overall sustainability of the village. Preserving the pre-school is integral to the future of the school and overall community that we live in. As a charity, the committee are all volunteers acting in their spare time. The Parish Council and other kind individuals have agreed to support us with lease negotiations and other projects.

The attendees unanimously voted in favour of a 25 year lease with a 12 month rent free period, £2,000 per year for the subsequent 4 years and then 50% market rent for the remaining 20 year period. Whilst the pre-school has flourished since its Outstanding grading from Ofsted, and numbers of children attending have grown so that finances have improved, we are conscious that committing to rent payments could threaten its financial viability. We are continuing to negotiate this with the Council to obtain the best available option for the pre-school. We need to renew with a long lease in order to raise funds through grants and other donors to repair the roof. What next for The Old Hall and attached Chapel, 18 North End, Osmotherley?

For almost 400 years the Old Hall and its chapel has served as a place of catholic spirituality and worship. Its history can be traced back to 1683, when the Old Hall was donated to a group of Franciscan monks to minister to the local community and support pilgrims visiting the Shrine on the hill above Mount Grace Priory. It is a part of our rich ecumenical community.

Sadly, the Hall has been left empty for some years. However, the RC Diocese of Middlesbrough is now looking for ideas which would support the continued and sustainable use of the property and the chapel. The Bishop has proposed a meeting in October to hear from all interested parties.

We have formed an interest group and would welcome hearing from or meeting anyone with an interest, curiosity, knowledge, expertise or ideas on how this unique property could be brought back to life.

This is a great opportunity for us to bring this significant house and garden back into use as an asset for our community, and for those visiting Osmotherley, the Lady Chapel and Mount Grace Priory. Please contact either Sue Coward
